## **SNAP (Food Stamps) and TEA Keep Reading – YOU MAY QUALIFY**

Forms available on table by front desk at Winslow Community Meals

### **General Program Requirements**

In order to qualify for this benefit program, you must be a resident of the state of Arkansas and fall into one of two groups: (1) those with a current bank balance (savings and checking combined) under \$2,001, or (2) those with a current bank balance (savings and checking combined) under \$3,001 who share their household with a person or persons age 60 and over, or with a person with a disability (a child, your spouse, a parent, or yourself).

In order to qualify, you must have an annual household income (before taxes) that is below the following amounts:

1 - \$15,678	5 - \$37,414
2 - \$21,112	6 - \$42,848
3 - \$26,546	7 - \$48,282
4 - \$31,980	8*- \$53,716

\*For households with more than eight people, add \$5,434 per additional person. Always check with the appropriate managing agency to ensure the most accurate guidelines.



Gary, the son of Bruce and Rosa Lee Lunsford, began his life in Arkansas when the family moved to Bentonville and then settled in Fayetteville four years later. The family joined Central Methodist Church. Gary attended Washington Elementary and was a 1960 Fayetteville High School graduate. He played for the 1957 undefeated football team and embraced Fayetteville's public schools' integration. He began his mastery of carpentry and woodworking by working with and learning from his dad. He was a part of the construction crew that built the Mountain Inn across from the Washington County courthouse. Gary joined the Marine Corps in 1960 but in less than six months received an honorable discharge after an accident from faulty explosives caused deafness in his left ear. He returned to Fayetteville where he earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts at the University of Arkansas. Gary's incredible life experiences continued when he moved to Washington, D.C. in the 1960s and joined the Capitol Hill police force. During his time away from Fayetteville, he learned and loved skydiving with over four hundred jumps, learned to snow ski, raced stock cars where he suffered a spinal injury, and even attended the Woodstock music festival. He tried out for the Washington Redskins football team and earned membership but did not join and instead came back to Fayetteville to support family. Gary's life path then included being a bouncer with his older brother, Porter, at The Huddle Club on College Avenue, an art teacher at Woodland Junior High School and even running the horse-riding concession at Devil's Den State Park for a summer. He then opened his woodworking shop in a bay at the Schlitz beer distributorship but soon established his shop in the old Fayetteville Lumber Company yard behind the store fronts in the Dickson Street entertainment district.



It was then he married the love of his life, Marty Jones, fathered and raised three sons, Jason, Quentin and Allan. He continued carpentry, woodworking and substitute teaching until he received the call to go into ministry. He organized and travelled on several mission trips in South America, Africa and Russia. Gary became Pastor of visitation at Central United Methodist Church. He pastored several Methodist churches in Northwest Arkansas, including St. James and Wiggins in Fayetteville and congregations at Rhea's Mill, Winslow, Lincoln and Morrow. He loved God, his family, the Razorbacks, riding his motorcycle, old cars, down-home cooking, chocolate cake, stray dogs, Siamese cats, mission work, talking about old Fayetteville and story-telling, traveling, Sunday

afternoon drives, backyard barbecues, swimming in the river and woodworking. Most of all, Gary loved people.

He is preceded in death by his parents, Bruce and RosaLee Lunsford, and two brothers, Porter and David Lunsford.

He is survived by his wife, Marty, his three sons, Jason, Quentin and Allan, five grandchildren, his sister, Barbara Pryor, and his brother, Scott Lunsford. Gary did more in his 75 years than most would do in a hundred. He was a popular and well-loved man and will be sorely missed.

A memorial service will be held at 10:00 am, Tuesday, January 30, 2018 at Central United Methodist Church in Fayetteville, under the direction of Moore's Chapel.

We asked for a letter of support for our effort from The Winslow City Council, and the WCDC, they were both pleased to do this and wrote two very descriptive letters for us; we thank you Randy Jarnagan, (Mayor of Winslow), and Ken Stout of the WCDC.

Gary Simpson continued to meet with Dr. Ben, Superintendent of the Greenland School system, attended their meetings and pursued other avenues of need, finance, and interest. During this time frame we became aware that the upkeep on mowing the grass was about \$5000.00 per year. Gary continued to meet with the Arkansas Law Clinic to refine and acquire the documents our organization would need to receive the property.

On January 19, 2016, I was asked to be acting president of the WCCA, and was confirmed at that meeting. I began immediately to assume those duties and make contact with all persons and agencies concerning our endeavor to acquire the Winslow School property. It has been my distinct privilege to meet and work with many great, generous, and energetic people in the process of attaining our goal to get our school back.

In less than a year, we had possession of the property, in three more months we had a ten year lease that was renewable indefinitely. The next seven months resulted in the wiring and electrification of the whole building, (Gymnasium, Cafetorium), also the repair of

the roof, the repair and installation of a new and improved drainage system; and improvement to the upper parking lot, the installation of all the plumbing and fixtures, and the installation of a comprehensive security system. I designed and printed fundraising letters, also sent thank you notes to those who responded. I made one trip to Blue Eye Arkansas for 50/50 grant information. I made one trip to Harrison Arkansas to attend a grant seminar, both at my expense. Shirley Thomas and I worked on two grants that she wrote, one of which was declined, the other has not been approved yet. There has been extensive work cleaning and preparing the Gymnasium and Cafetorium for painting, the restoration of the giant squirrel above the bleachers, new paint in the lower and upper levels, installation of mirrors and privacy panels in all bathrooms with paper dispensers and much work in the kitchen. There are so many other things to numerous to mention.

It has been my good pleasure these last almost four years to be a member of the WCCA and be instrumental in seeing these things come to pass. To everyone who has helped, worked, donated their time and or money to help and support me in this great endeavor for the benefit of the community of Winslow Arkansas I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

### THE POWER TO BECOME

In his poem *Two Ghosts*, Thomas Jones identifies ghosts which continually haunt him — one was the boy he used to be; the other the man he might have been. Both were deeply disturbing... the boy he used to be held such high hopes for the man he was to be. The man he was felt deep regret for what he might have been.

Probably all of us, to some degree, are haunted by these same ghosts! The message of the Bible is that we can still do something about the person we might have been. *John 1.12* says that Jesus gives those who receive Him "*the power to become sons of God.*"

*"The power to become!"* is what we all need! To become is "to change, grow, come to be something more than we are." Christianity is about "becoming!" Consider...

**1) We Are Never As Good As We Ought To Be.** We are not perfect. (*Romans 3.23; 1 John 1.8.*) Christianity is not a state of sinless perfection, but a "*reaching forth*" and "*pressing on*" toward "*the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.*" (*Philippians 3.13-14.*) We must keep maturing, growing, becoming!

**2) The Possibility Of Change Is The Hope Of Us All.** We do not have to stay where we are or be what we've always been! Jesus said, in *John 12.36*, "*You may become sons of light.*" (NIV) In writing to Christians at Corinth, Paul refers to a black catalogue of moral weakness, perversity and deficiency: adulterers, prostitutes, homosexuals, thieves, swindlers. (*1 Corinthians 6.9-10.*) Then he says, "*And that is what some of you were.*" (6.11/NIV) That is what they had been, but they had become something else!

**3) We Have The Power To Become!** God created us for lofty heights! We can keep pressing onward and upward. Not only were we created with great expectations, we were given resources to fulfill those expectations. The Greek word for "*power*" in *John 1.12* indicates "*physical and mental power, ability, strength.*" (*Thayer's Greek Lexicon*, p. 225.) And to those who surrender to Him in obedience, Jesus gives the "*power*" to become.

Life's biggest question is not, "Who are you?" but "Who are you becoming...?" You can still do something, about becoming the person you might have been! Why not start now????
