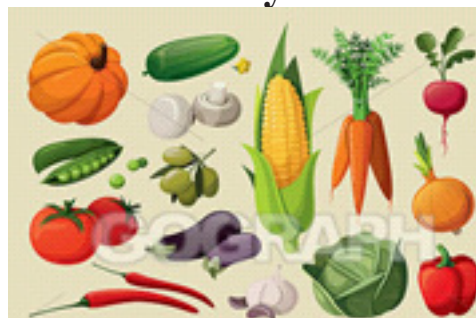

Wow! We are looking back and asking, “Where did summer go?” And how can we be planning our 3rd Annual FallFest Fundraiser already?

Surprisingly, less than two years ago, Greenland School District returned the campus property to the City of Winslow. How much progress have we made?

We feel like we’ve come a long way in those two years.

Granted, we were already working and cleaning and repairing long before the property was returned, but now we see the beneficial outcomes of the gym and cafeteria being utilized by friends, neighbors and the community for a variety of events. Y’all have used the facilities for wedding receptions, graduation parties, Christmas gatherings, birthdays, anniversaries and community events raising money for neighbors in need. That was a major goal of the WCCA and we are so pleased that we’ve achieved it and so much more.

Our next big fundraising event will be in September during Fayetteville’s annual Bikes, Blues and BBQ. Along with our good friends at the MountainTop Gun Shop, we are hosting a two-day gun show event on September 28th and 29th from 9am until 5pm.

I am recruiting volunteers to help with the success of this event. We are expecting lots of motorcycles to roll through our area and we want to give them a memorable experience so that we can count on their annual visits and their open wallets to raise money from OUTSIDE our small community. Also, we are offering a discount to local vendors for a booth at this event. If you are interested in a booth, contact Bill or Tracy Barnett at the MountainTop Gun Shop to reserve your space. Additionally, in September, the WCCA will be working a water station along the Winslow Run route and setting up a table for membership drive during Winfest 2018. Furthermore, we need volunteers in the next few weeks to help with painting the exterior of the Gym/Cafeteria. We desperately need paint spraying equipment, but if no neighbor can loan us this equipment, we’re going to be painting with rollers and brushes. Regardless, volunteers for this MAJOR endeavor are needed and will be appreciated. Ideally, this will be completed well before the gun show event to show the world our Winslow pride.

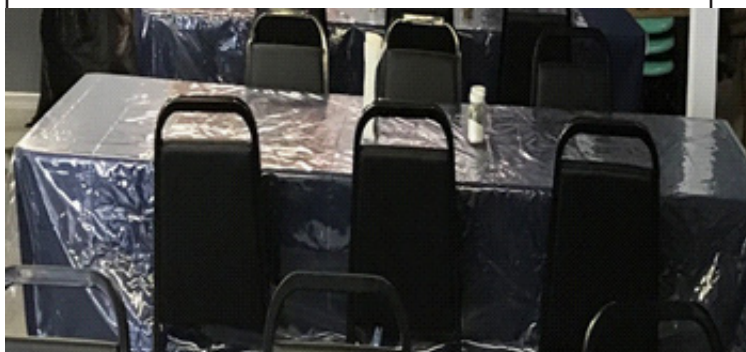
Pat was an avid reader. She frequented the Winslow Library at least once a week and loved Patricia Cornwell books. She was always on the list for her latest book.

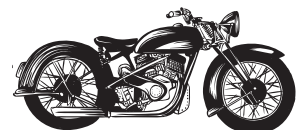

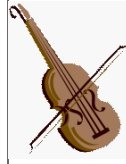

ELECTIVES OF LIFE

Life is a school. From the moment we are born, we begin to learn and we really never quit learning until we die. Though we may have many instructors in the school of life, if we are wise we will learn from the world's greatest Teacher — Jesus Christ!

In most schools there are two kinds of courses — required ones and electives. The first *must* be taken; the latter *may* be taken. As in other schools, the school of life offers both kinds of courses. There are some things in which we have no choice. There are other areas where we must make a decision. Required courses are sorrow, death, and judgment. (*cf. Hebrews 9.27.*) They come to all. It is what we do with life's electives, however, by which we will be graded. Consider some important electives of life...

1) Whether Your Life Is A Blessing Or A Curse. You can break hearts or mend them; you can do good or evil; you can bring misery or joy into the lives of others. Moses told the children of Israel, "*I have set before you... blessing and cursing...*" (*Deuteronomy 30.19.*) Young people can choose to bring honor and joy to their parents or grief and heartache. (See *Proverbs 23.25 17.25.*) We can leave behind a trail of happiness or one of misery and woe.

2) Which Road You Walk In Life. Jesus said: "*Enter by the narrow gate; for the gate is wide, and the way is broad that leads to destruction; and many are those who enter by it. For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life; and few are those who find it.*" (*Matthew 7.13-14.*) You can choose to serve God or Satan! Everything depends on your choice of roads. People want to argue that there are many roads to God. But Jesus insisted that there is only one way that leads to life — and another that goes to destruction!

3) What Your Eternal Destiny Will Be. Just as there are two roads in life, there are two destinations at the end of it. There is heaven, the home of the soul; and there is hell, the place of eternal punishment. (*Revelation 21.8.*) To live with God in eternity we must make preparation in life. Unending fellowship with God begins with obedience. (*Hebrews 5.8-9.*) The choice is ours to make. God allows us to choose freely.

Life has been placed in our hands. What we do with it is up to us!
