## City Council Corner

Thanks to those who put up decorations at City Hall and downtown, we're looking festive for the annual Winslow Christmas Parade to be held the evening of Saturday, December 9th at dusk.

As an early present, construction of the 8 foot wide, 1/3 mile long asphalt trail around the ball field at Larry "Tiny" Jarnagan Park (a.k.a. Slicker Park) is complete. The loop, paid for in part by a \$100,000 Arkansas Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism grant, provides exercise opportunities for our community and accessibility to park amenities for people with disabilities. Sales tax funds covered remaining project costs. Go take a walk or roll on one of these sunny winter afternoons.



Our Water Department crew is still working on getting the new billing software for water system accounts running smoothly and to get everything out on time. We're seeing improvement each month.

We now have outdoor wifi access downtown for market merchants and customers who need to use it. Inquire at City Hall for details.

Mayor Jarnagan was honored with an invitation to attend a Communities Unlimited meeting in Monticello in October to discuss small water systems and to help us pursue funding opportunities for our water system improvements. Winslow city government is trying every day to get money to upgrade our system. Our city passed the Arkansas Legislative Audit with no issues of concern.

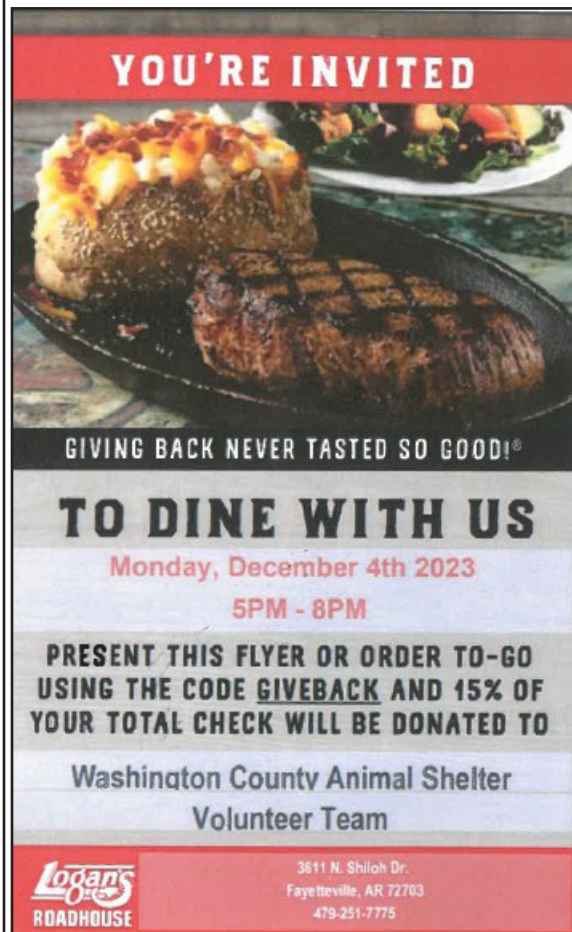

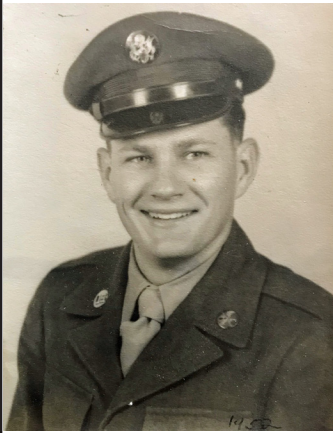

Albert Eugene "Gene" King, 96, of Fayetteville, passed away Saturday, October 28, 2023 in Fayetteville. He was born July 26, 1927 in Springdale, AR to William Albert and Maggie Jane Reed King.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife of 66 years, Gloria Ann Lux King; and two sisters, Nellie Catherine Dillahunty and Doris Southerland.

Gene was a U.S. Army veteran (retired) having served in WWII, the Korean Conflict and Vietnam. December 13, 1962 - November 12, 2023

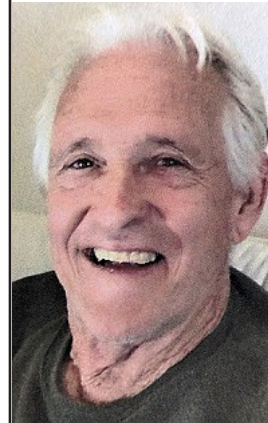

## John Virgil Crone

September 27, 1945 - November 11, 2023

John Virgil Crone, 78, passed away peacefully on November 11, 2023, at his residence in Fayetteville, Ark., surrounded by his loving family.



Born September 27, 1945, in Beloit, Wis., to Richard Duane Crone and Jean Katherine Spies Crone, he received a Bachelor of Landscape Architecture from the University of Georgia in his hometown of Athens, Ga. John met Elizabeth Battson, his first wife, while working abroad in Christchurch, New Zealand. After a two-year stint in London with an architecture firm, he returned to the U.S. to pursue a Masters of Regional Planning at the University of Pennsylvania where he studied with Ian McCarg (Design with

Nature).

The couple ventured to Winslow, Ark., to complete his thesis and to homestead on a farm inherited from John's maternal grandfather, Chester Beck Spies, who had served as an engineer under the Civilian Conservation Corps. John and "Liz" reclaimed the Winslow property and raised three children, Christopher, Ben and Jonathan, who were joined by Ian Dickie, Elizabeth's first child.

In 1980, John joined the faculty of the Fay Jones School of Architecture, University of Arkansas, Fayetteville. He certified the School of Landscape Architecture and served as a professor for 30 years. Active in the Studies Abroad program, he enjoyed leading student tours of the great plazas and public gardens of Italy, France, and England. A friendship with timber baron/philanthropist Verna Cook Garvin led her to bequeath a 210-acre botanical garden on Lake Hamilton to the University and to commission Fay Jones and partner Maurice Jennings to design a stunning chapel pavilion in the woodland environment now known as Garvin Gardens.

As Fayetteville's woods and farmland gave way to urban development, John teamed up with professor emeritus Karen Rollet-Crocker to establish the criteria for an award-winning GIS Study to identify and preserve the best green sites, introducing students to conservation planning on a regional scale. His academic research included urban cycling paths, traffic roundabouts, and a sabbatical with his family in Bali, Indonesia. Active in the community, John served on Fayetteville's planning commission, aiming to balance development with sensitivity to the ecosystem.

Upon his second marriage to Camilla Romund (1984), John built a home in Fayetteville's historic district and a desert cabin in Morongo Valley, Calif., where he hosted numerous hikers.

In retirement, work was his play, and "Croneland" consisted of dreaming up new projects, managing investment properties and hosting Airbnbs. Family time was spent traveling, tinkering, camping, strumming his guitar, riding motorcycles, and taking his grandchildren to his favorite swimming holes.

He is survived by his wife, Camille Crone, Elizabeth Crone of Winslow, three sons, Christopher John Crone, Ben Spies Crone, Jonathan Day Crone of Fayetteville; four grandchildren, Isabel Skye Crone, Beckham James Crone, Johnny Kolson Crone, and Lily Spies Crone; two sisters, Anne Hersh of New York and Katherine (Katy) Christie of Richmond, Calif., and two stepdaughters,

Emily Romund of Richmond, Calif., and Alana Romund of San Francisco.

His ashes will be interred next to his mother's gravestone on the Winslow farm where John built the dream house that she designed. During his final months in hospice, he was comforted by the power of prayer, his beloved family and compassionate caregivers Marie Gonzales and Marlise Rass. On November 15, a memorial celebration on the Winslow farm honored his legacy as a father, educator and dreamer who lived life on his own terms.

### **Lela Ann Preston (Cousins)**

Lela Ann Preston, 70, of Chester, passed away Monday, May 22, 2023 in her home. She was born July 29, 1952 in Lubbock, Texas. She was a homemaker, a loving mother, nana and "mom" to countless others. She is preceded in death by her father Leon Cousins; a sister Betty Carlene Cousins; two brothers David and Gary Cousins.

She is survived by a daughter, LaDonna Noel and husband, Tim of Winslow; two sons, Greg Preston and wife, Barbara of Chester, Jeff Preston of Marathon, Florida; her mother, Betty Jean Cousins of Dustin, Oklahoma; her siblings, Sandy Johnson, Marnae Summers, Rusty, Edward, Larry, George and John Cousins, Earl Wayne Wilhite; five grandchildren and one great grandchild; numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and loved ones.

She was so much more than the words listed in the obituary.....

She was the 2nd child (and eldest daughter) of 12 children. She was born in Lubbock, Texas but lived in Arizona, Oklahoma and Arkansas, where she made her home in the small community of Winslow for over 40 years, raising her 3 children, most of which as a single mother, and in the small town of Cedarville, AR for the last several years with her eldest son and his family, where she carved out a lifetime of friendships and memories. As a child, she picked cotton for a time (for years, she still had a cotton boll in a drawer).

She was a Kindergarten parent volunteer, where her daughter had to call her 'Mrs. Preston' instead of 'Mommy'. She was a 4-H co-leader and parent volunteer, helping her children and grandchildren raise chickens and turkeys, building pin-hole cameras, planting watermelons and sunflowers and long hours of working on project books. She was a gifted seamstress, making and mending clothing for her children, grandchildren, great granddaughter and countless friends. She also loved to crochet, embroider and quilt, making blankets and quilts for those same children and others she loved, to wrap up in and sleep under. She loved to fish and had plans to take her youngest grandson and her great granddaughter this summer. She loved to read (a love she passed on), accumulating quite a large collection of Harlequin novels (much to her children's chagrin) and anything written by lifelong friend, Velda Brotherton.

When her children were in school at Winslow (once a Squirrel, always a Squirrel), she could be found volunteering in any number of ways and many times could be found in the concession stand during any given game. She also was a West Fork Tiger and a Cedarville Pirate. She loved making Christmas stockings for her grandchildren's classrooms and made sure there were extras, just in case. Throughout her life, she was 'Mom' and 'Nana' to not just her own, but also scores of other children, many of whom still call her that to this day.

She believed in education immensely and combined that with her love of children. As a single mother, she went back to finish her college degree in Elementary Education using the Single Parent Scholarship. Her path changed course after a severe car wreck left her unable to stand up to that pursuit, switching to Social Work, where she felt she could still be of service to children. She graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Social Work from the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville. But, by that time, she was unable to work due to those same severe injuries.

She was baptized at the Dustin Baptist Church, where she taught Sunday school. She went on to teach Sunday school in various churches throughout her lifetime. After the car wreck, she was unable to attend traditional church services, but worshipped in her home, listening to gospel songs, watching services on TV and reading her Bible. One of the first songs she taught her children, grandchildren and great granddaughter was Jesus Loves Me, which she would also sing when they were sick or were hurting. Throughout her lifetime, when most people would have just laid down and given up, she kept her faith. Her faith was battered and, many times, she THOUGHT of giving up, but she kept going, knowing that no matter what happened, GOD was in control, had a plan and was with her. Her favorite song was "Why Me Lord" by Kris Kristofferson; she said that no matter what happened in her life, she was blessed. She passed that faith on, not only to her own, but to everyone that she came in contact with.

She leaves behind an amazing, far-reaching legacy...a legacy of grit, determination, perseverance and, most importantly, love. WE ARE HER LEGACY.

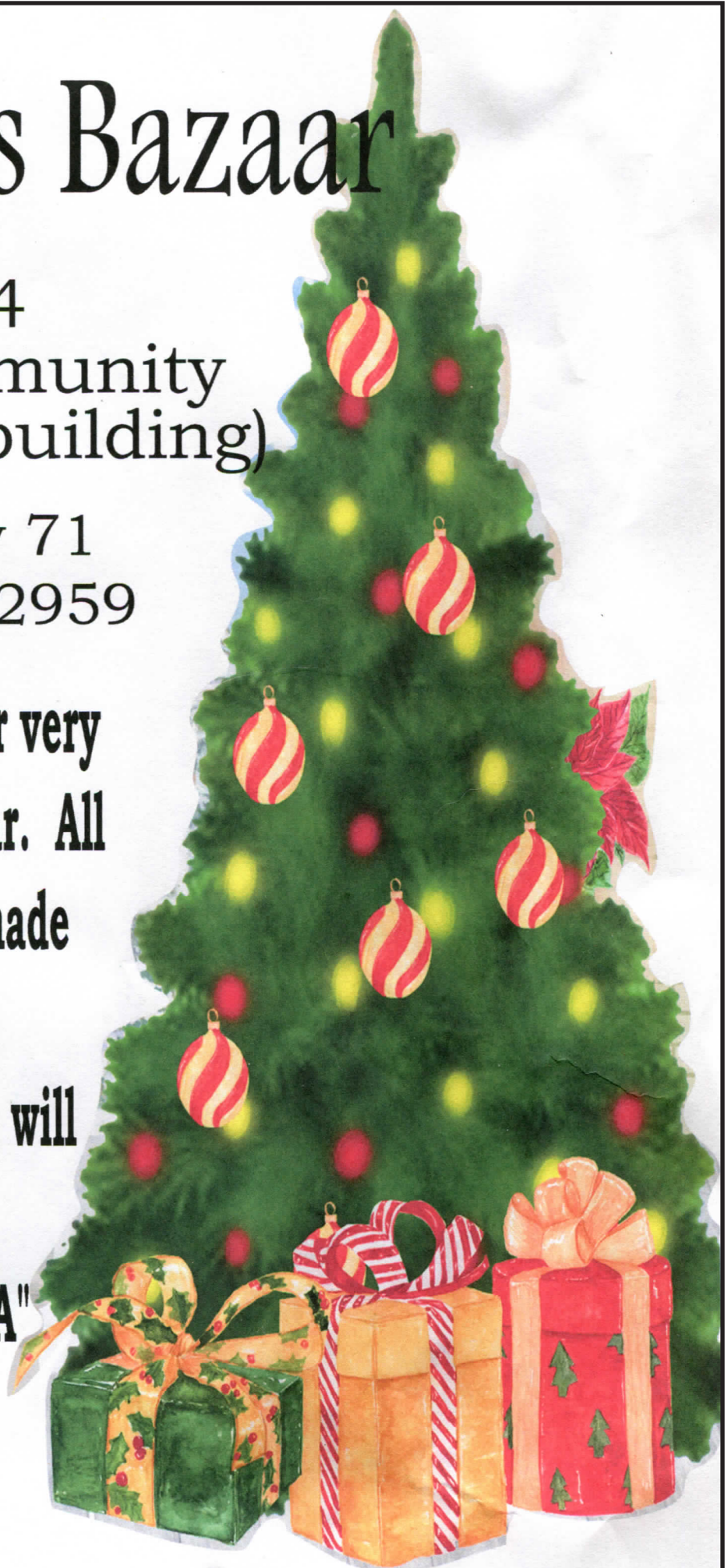

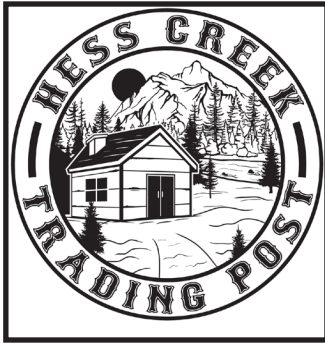

#### **Robyn DeVore**

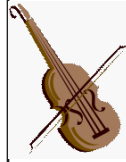
Robyn has been on the fire department for four years. She has completed the requirements for an active firefighter and has taken EMR certification.

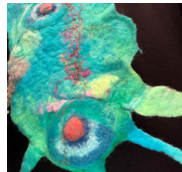

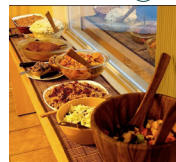

And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand,

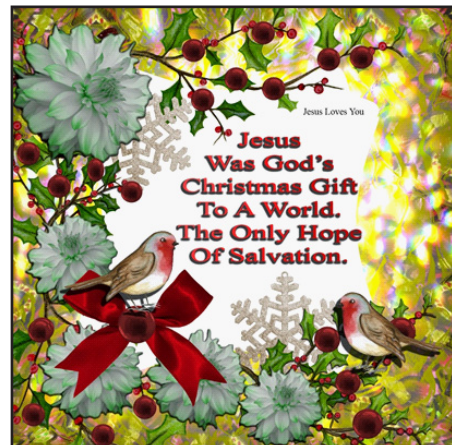
