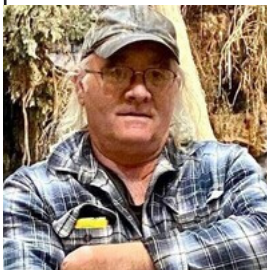
time with her grandchildren.

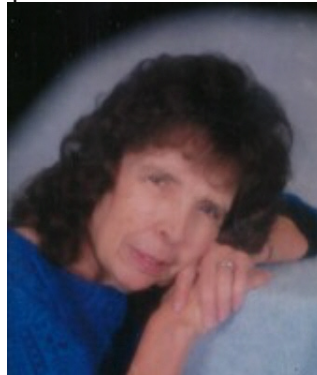
above all loved time with his grandchildren.

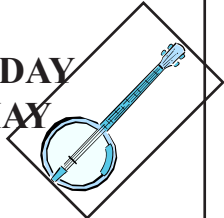
