The department has purchased an Automatic Semi Tractor for the tanker/pumper support.

New Fire supply 2 1/2 and 3" hose has been purchased to get all the supply hose in compliance.

The department is putting up for bid an International semi tractor and a slightly damaged service bed. All sealed bids will be taken by the BMFD Board until the April 2025 board meeting. Sealed bids will be opened at the meeting.

A Ford Tanker will soon be available to add to the BMFD water support. The 3rd axle from the international truck is being used to help support the Ford Tanker extra water weight.

I appreciate all the comments of support that we get from the people of the community.

I also want to thank our neighboring Fire Departments for the mutual aid on calls. Sunset, Whitehouse, West Fork, Strickler and District 3 all make calls in Fire and Rescue support.

Winslow will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of the “PETTICOAT GOVERNMENT” with a parade, a reenactment swearing in the ladies, a presentation by the Daughters of the American of a plaque for the Helen Dunlap Mountain School for Girls, and to end with cake and ice cream until we run out. (With a big cake and over two hundred cupcakes there should be plenty.)

One hundred years ago, the men of Winslow were tired of the women complaining about the way they ran the city.

When election time rolled around and the women decided to run for office. The men got together, withdrew their names from the ballot and chuckling said, “Let the women try to run the city for a year and just see how much they can mess up. They’ll sit around, drink pink tea and gossip, or else they’ll get into a hair pulling fight over some issue”.

The women put together a slate of candidates consisting of Maud Duncan as Mayor, Audie Crider as Recorder and Clerk, Martha Winn as Treasurer, council women, Etta Black, Daisy Miller, Bee Cherveney, Florence Marley, Lida Cole, and Stella Winn. They won unanimously.

There was no hair pulling, no pink tea nor gossip. The ladies got down to business and accomplished more in the first year than the men had in several years. They cleaned up their own yards planting flowers and encouraged others in town to do the same. The road up West Mountain was straightened out. The jail was demolished and disappeared. The ladies ran again in 1926 and won a second term.

When the men asked them to run a third time in 1927 they declined saying they were too busy with their other endeavors.

Come on out and join us for a bit of history, lots of fun, and good cake and ice cream. All women are invited to walk in the parade, ride a bike, a horse, a buggy, a scooter, or even a walker or wheel chair. The parade will be an abbreviated version just around Peek’s Park and downtown. We’ll even let the men have a place to gather and walk together to show support of the women.

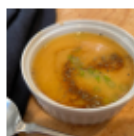

From The Voice Of One On The Top Of Brentwood Mountain!

Revelation 14:6,7 And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, Saying with a **loud voice, Fear God**, and give glory to **him**; for the hour of his judgment is come: and worship **him that made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and the fountains of waters.**

An old familiar story about a beautiful woman and a talking snake

In Genesis 2:16 **God has given instructions how to keep safe and be happy.** In these instructions the first thing God tells them is what to eat. And then in Genesis 2:17 God tells Her what to avoid. In this God is showing the law of cause and effect that all of the universe operates on and as Zig Ziegler said "good cause good effect bad cause bad effect" how hard is that? Dear sweet Ellen gives us some very timely even motherly advice, she tells us we need to learn to reason from cause to effect. God has given us this awesome ability to learn this and then He gives us the power to act on it, but the devil gives us a short term cause of self-gratification that appeals to our selfish nature.

Mistake Vs. Sin. Question, is a mistake a sin? Are multiple mistakes a sin? Case in question story of Eve's first sin.

Question, was this a mistake? Was she told to never leave Adam's side? Was this a mistake or a sin? Are multiple mistakes a sin?

Did she sin when she went for a walk by herself in the garden?

Question, was this a mistake? Was she told to never go for a walk in the garden, was she told you have to stay in this little place (monastery)? I don't find that they were restricted to only the garden, what was the only restriction God placed on them?

Did she sin when she went and looked at the tree of knowledge of good and evil? It was not called the tree of (death).

Question, So would we say she has made a mistake or she sinned?

Is looking at the tree and its fruit Sin or a mistake?

If looking is only a mistake and not a sin, what then is the problem?

Genesis 3:6 gives us another look at a new dimension of this story. And when the woman **saw** that the tree [was] good for food, and that it [was] pleasant to the **eyes**, and a tree to be **desired** to make [one] wise, she **took** (was touching the problem?) of the fruit thereof, (next step) and did eat. I would

like to suggest that you most likely won't eat something if you don't touch it. Anyone that has ever eaten anything (good or bad) has had to touch it '101' how basic is that, and yet so profound. 1:15 Then when **lust hath conceived**, it bringeth forth **sin**: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth **death**. End of game.! But Christ came to give us life eternal O how little value the devil has gotten us to place on life yet God has placed so much value on life that He was willing to give it up in His Son that we might have eternal life.

▶ 1 Corinthians 10:12 Wherefore let him that thinketh he standeth take heed lest he fall.

▶ 10:13 There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God [is] faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; **but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear [it].**

▶ 10:14 Wherefore, my dearly beloved, flee from idolatry.

God's word says 'no temptation, not 'Sin' has taken us. I am of the opinion that we need to be on our guard against temptation, and flee from it and we won't sin. I believe the devil has us so busy focusing on sin we don't even see the temptation as temptation and he springs the trap and we wonder how or why this happened to me. Temptations indulged are mistakes that are steps that lead to sin. And every step taken gives us strength to take the next while weakening us to resist the next step
