He loved family gatherings, joking around, playing Skip-Bo, teasing the kids, and telling amazing vibrant stories you never tired of hearing. He instilled in his children and grand-children the importance of hard work, education, honesty, keeping your word and loving your family. He loved to sit out on his front porch and talk to anyone who came by. He never knew a stranger, always quick with a knee slapping joke. He loved a good prank, like asking someone to pick up wheelbarrow steering fluid, wheelbarrow seeds and the best advice... "Don't take any wooden nickels but get all the wooden quarters you can."



RECYCLING TIPS from a procrastinator:



The Amazing Cucumber


This information was in The New York Times several weeks ago as part of their "Spotlight on the Home" series that highlighted creative and fanciful ways to solve common problems.



- 1. Cucumbers contain most of the vitamins you need every day, just one cucumber contains Vitamin B1, Vitamin B2, Vitamin B3, Vitamin B5, Vitamin B6, Folic Acid, Vitamin C, Calcium, Iron, Magnesium, Phosphorus, Potassium and Zinc.



WITHOUT GOD!

In writing to Christians at Ephesus, Paul reminded them that there had once been a time, when they were without hope and "without God in the world." (Ephesians 2.12.) A world "without God" is too horrible to contemplate. Consider...

Without God there is no basis for decency or morality. There are only subjective personal opinions about "good" or "evil." As Dostoevsky noted in *The Brothers Karamasov*, "Everything is permitted!" So if Hitler decides to murder 6 million Jews or a pedophile abuses innocent children who can say they are wrong?? Apart from the character and authority of God, there is no moral argument against murder, rape, or any other crime.

Without God there is no meaning in life. What is life all about? The big questions are always there! "Who am I...? Why am I here...? Where am I going...?" We may try to ignore them but, sooner or later, they intrude. Without God, there is no answer! Man becomes merely a biological accident headed for extinction. But if God is there, then human history and our own lives have meaning and purpose.

Without God There is No Humanity And No Freedom. When people reject God as Creator, they cheapen and destroy themselves! If there is no God, there is no freedom of human will. Apart from God, as Jefferson recognized in the Declaration of Independence, there are no inalienable human rights. The Bible declares, "where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom." (2 Corinthians 3.17.) Evolution confers no rights. Molecules confer no rights. Rights depend upon a moral source. No rights giver, no rights!

Without God we are reduced to utter helplessness. If God is not there, the universe is a malevolent, hostile place. We have no One we can rely on who is bigger, stronger, better, wiser than ourselves. We are all alone! God is the God of all hope. (Romans 15.13.)
