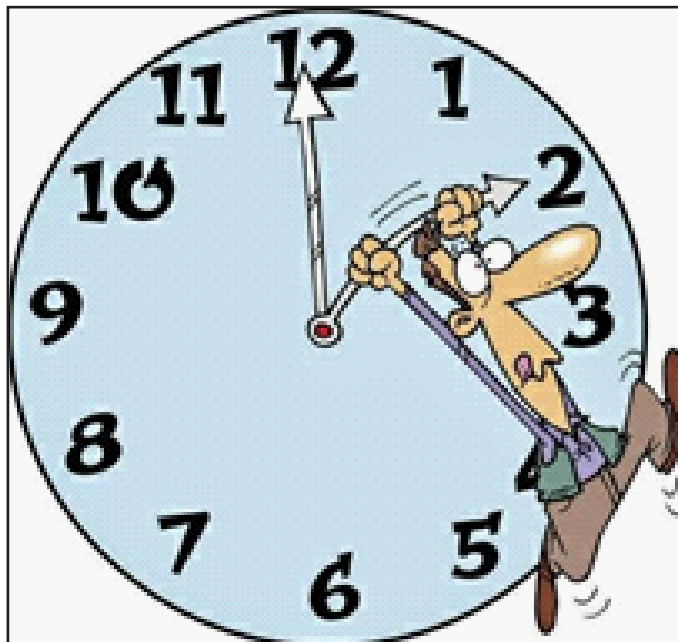

# 1 – Tip:

When selecting fresh product, always buy only what you think you will use before it spoils. If you do end up with a large quantity (from gardens, friends, or a deal you can't resist, pick out the best quality items and preserve the rest by canning, drying or freezing.

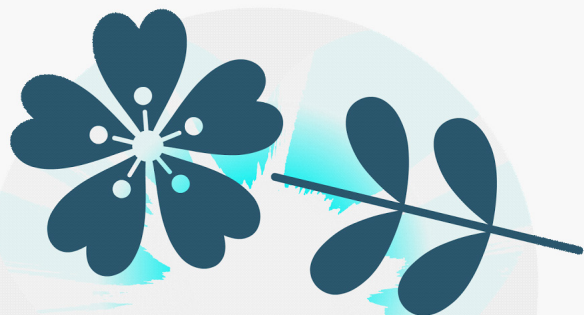

## HELP SUPPORT YOUR LOCAL ANIMAL SHELTER

Thousands of pets are deserted, abandoned, or lost each year. Left to fend for themselves they either die or become a nuisance. In cities they live off what they can find in dumpsters, garbage cans, or trash left on the streets. In the rural areas dogs kill small wildlife, farmers' chickens, newborn livestock. Often forming packs and go after young cattle and other small livestock. Cats become feral and live off whatever they can find. In both cases they continue to breed and the numbers increase. Everyone blames the animals that were "dumped" when in fact it was neither their fault nor their choice.

Animal shelters come in all sizes, county, city, and individual. There is one nearby, but they do need help to continue accepting these animals. They have a small staff and rely on the wonderful volunteers that so generously donate their time and talents. These shelters are funded by the jurisdiction it is governed by. Each one has a tight budget and relies on grants and donations to continue operating. The donations do not have to be monetary. Each shelter has a wish list of items they need. The Lester C. Howick Shelter is the Washington County Shelter located at 801 Clydesdale Dr. Fayetteville, AR 72704. In the last couple years their budget has been cut by about 3% due to county budget cuts. 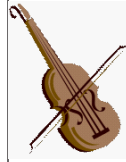

### JESUS CLOSED THE BOOK

Luke 4.16-20 tells of Jesus reading the Scriptures during a worship service in Nazareth. Such services followed a rigid pattern. After the recitation of the *Shema* and 19 Benedictions, seven different men were called to read passages from the *Law*. Then someone would be invited to read from the *Prophets* and preach a sermon. It was this part that Jesus was took. When He was done, the *KJV* and *NAS* say Jesus "closed the book..." (Vs. 20.) He rolled up the scroll and returned it to the sacred Ark for storage.

There is something thought-provoking about the words "Jesus closed the book..." They suggest more than the bare statement of fact.

1) **Jesus Closed The Book On Prophecy.** He Himself was the fulfillment of the passage he read from Isaiah that day in the Synagogue. (Vs. 21.) Jesus was the end to which the prophets looked: More than 320 Old Testament prophecies relate to the birth, life, death and resurrection of Christ. His biography was written before He was born. In the crucifixion alone, 33 different prophecies concerning Christ were fulfilled. Other religions have holy books; But there is nothing in them like the fulfilled prophecies of the Bible with their specific, detailed, unambiguous predictions!

2) **Jesus Closed The Book On The Old Testament.** "To Be Continued..." might be written at the end of the Old Testament. It was not the whole story; Not God's complete revelation. *Malachi* had written of a "Sun of Righteousness" who would arise with healing in His wings. (4.2.) Jesus took the old law out of the way "abolishing in His flesh the enmity, which is the Law of commandments contained in ordinances, so that in Himself He might make the two into one new man, thus establishing peace..." (Ephesians 2.15). The Old Covenant is no longer God's operative law. The *Book of Hebrews* declares, "He has made the first obsolete... (and) ready to disappear." (8.13.) So much religious confusion could be eliminated by understanding that Jesus closed the book on the Old Testament!

3) **Jesus Closed The Book On God's Plan Of Salvation.** God devised a plan for our salvation before the world was created. He promised it to Adam and Eve: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, And between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, And you shall bruise His heel." (Genesis 3.15). He gave glimpses of the plan through the prophets... (1 Peter 1.10-11). But it was not complete until Calvary! On the cross Jesus proclaimed, "It is finished!" (John 19.30.) Our debt was paid; God's plan was complete!

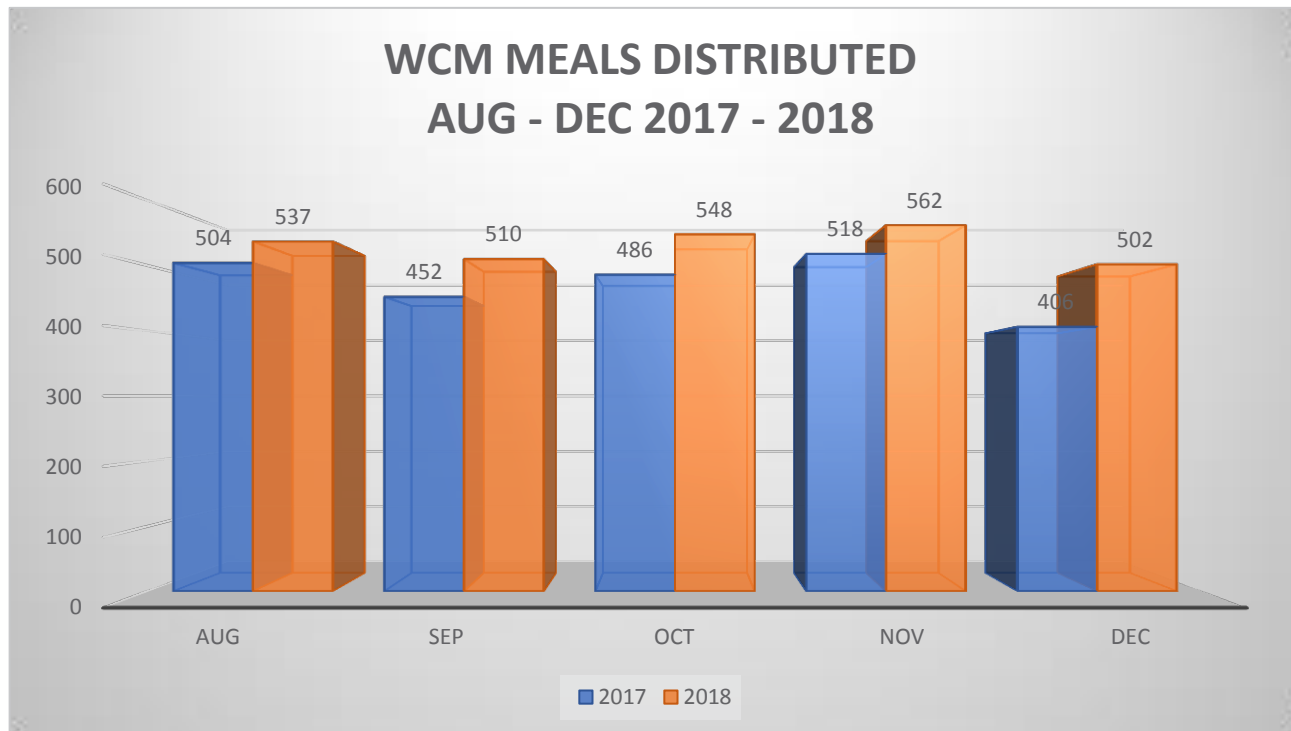
