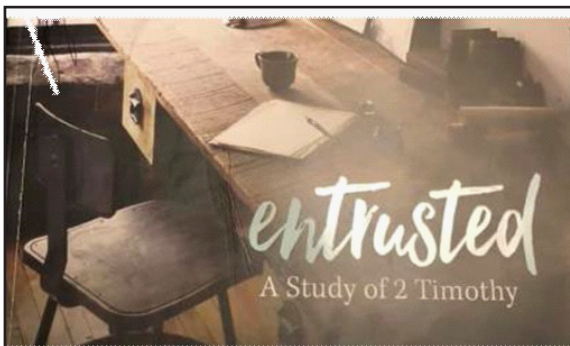

November 5, 1953~January 19, 2019

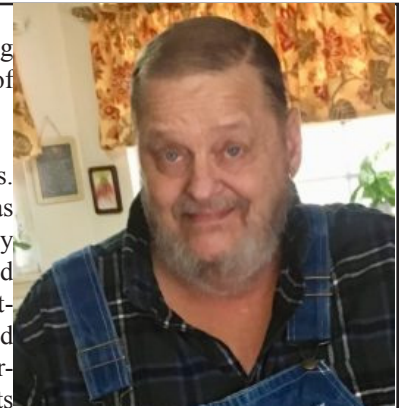

THE FORGOTTEN SON OF GOD

When our children were small, I gave them Bible verses to learn each week. When the youngest was about 4, his verse was *John 3.16*. He had a hard time with the word "Begotten." Instead of "only begotten Son," he kept saying "God gave His only forgotten son..."

Sadly it seems that this is exactly where Christ often is in today's world: —**FORGOTTEN!** Our world is unravelling in chaos and savagery because people have forgotten the Son of God! Christ may even be forgotten, by those who claim to love Him. He can even be forgotten at church! (cf. *Rev. 3.14-20*.) Note some ways...

1) Forgotten In Cultural Blindness. Jesus accused the church at Laodicea of forgetting Him because they failed to see Him! "You are blind," He said. (*Rev. 3.17*.) The condition still exists! *Romans 12.2* commands, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind..." We lose sight of Christ when we allow ourselves to be shaped by the world rather than by Him. We are constantly bombarded by messages from the world — from newspapers, TV, movies, magazines, and those among whom we live and work. It is not at all surprising that many professed Christians begin to think and act more like the world than like Christ.

2) Forgotten In Institutional Machinery. There is a sense in which people can get so "busy" with "church" activities that they forget all about Jesus. Many congregations are top-heavy with organization. There is a lot going on. The church becomes a collection of committees, meetings, programs, ministries, memos and events that maintain institutional momentum. Jesus gets lost in the bureaucratic shuffle. (*1 Corinthians 2.2*)

3) Forgotten In Preoccupation With Success. The church at Laodicea had a warped view of success. They judged by size, growth, wealth, prestige and power and said, "We have everything." Jesus judged by faithfulness and said, "You have nothing!" Often, today's church is more concerned with a false, secular definition of success than in loyalty to Jesus: Is attendance and giving up? Is our building imposing? But our Lord is looking for faithfulness! In *Revelation 3.10*, Jesus urged: "Be faithful until death, and I will give you the crown of life." Our purpose is not to build temples, set attendance records or retire church debt; It is to preach Jesus Christ and Him crucified!
