Happy New Year!

We got great news in December. The Arkansas Department of Agriculture granted \$262,800 of American Rescue Plan Act funds to help our city continue to replace out-of-date water meters with remote-read meters as part of our Water System Improvement Plan.

We also received a \$100,000 Arkansas Department of Parks, Heritage, and Tourism Facilities for Underdeveloped Neighborhoods (FUN) Park grant to build a 1/3 mile paved trail around the baseball field and an accessible parking pad on the west side of the bridge.

We have received comments about traffic rerouted through our neighborhoods when there have been accidents on I-49 and/or Highway 74. Mayor Jarnagan has parked his truck on Main St. to dissuade through traffic, but the city doesn't have control of state highways. Residents should direct related comments to the Arkansas Highway Department, Washington County Sheriff's Department, and our State Representative.

We had good weather and attendance for our annual Christmas Parade. Thank you to Rene Banks, Debbie Wells, and JoAnn Kyle for the beautiful holiday decorations at the museum, to our Mayor for the festive holiday lighting and for running the Christmas parade, and to all participants for helping us get into the holiday spirit.

Mayor Jarnagan and Winslow Water System technicians braved the cold to turn off water meters at several households over the holidays to reduce pipe breakage. How many cities have mayors that serve their communities hands-on like our Mayor Randy? The patience of those experiencing water trouble is appreciated. City employees have worked relentlessly through the holidays to take care of issues as quickly as possible.

The City will be hiring a maintenance person in February. Contact City Hall for more information if you're interested.

All residents are invited to visit City Hall during Saturday morning Coffee Klatch gatherings and are welcome to attend City Council meetings on third Mondays at 6pm.

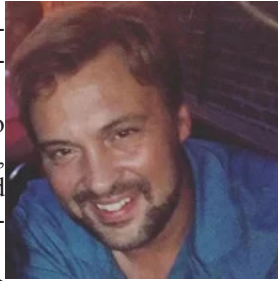
WINSLOW LOVED ONES WE HAVE LOST

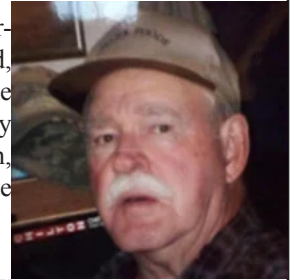

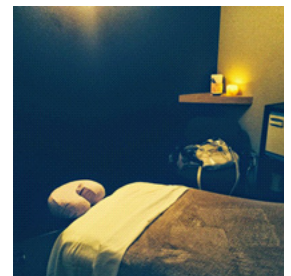

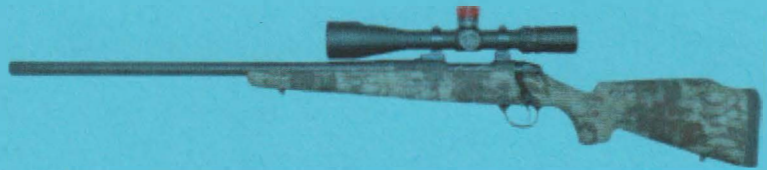

7 Signs of Jesus Soon Return

The Second sign I want you to think about is: The Gospel to the World

In 2014 I what I believe to have been an outstanding miracle from God, Amazing Facts became one of the only --- if not the only Christian ministries given permission to hold a full public evangelistic series in china since 1949, when missionaries were expelled. At 1.4 billion, the communist country has the world's largest population. At the end of our meetings, hundreds were baptized to the glory of God and DVDs of the meetings began to proliferate around the country.

And it's not just Amazing Facts; missionary-minded ministries everywhere have taken up the great commission to "go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). Interestingly enough, this sign of the end has been contingent upon another: the rise of technology. There are those whose only opportunity to learn about the gospel comes from a website. Satellites can now beam the light of God's truths into individual homes. Through the internet, television, satellite, radio, publishing, and word of mouth, the message is reaching into virtually every corner of the globe. This is actually the sign that triggers the Second Coming. The bible tells us that when every living person has had the opportunity to hear the gospel, when "this gospel of the kingdom [is] preached in all the world as a witness to all the nations, . . . then the end will come"(Matthew 24:14). Notice this important distinction: Christ will come when everyone in the world has been presented with the gospel, not when everyone has accepted it. One's response to the gospel, weather to accept or reject it, is determined by the free will of the individual.
