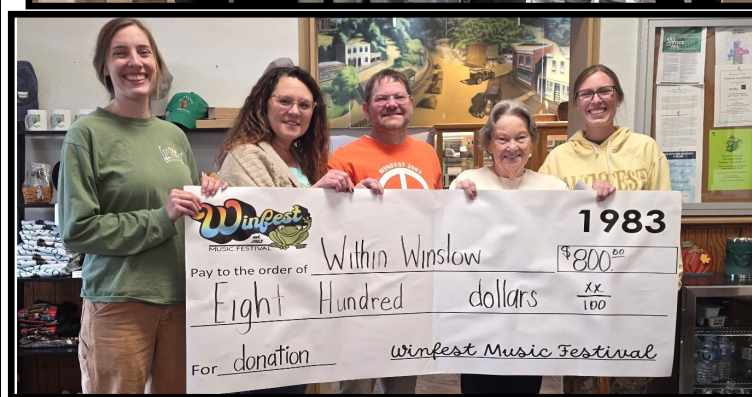

METER / SECURITY and HOOK-UP CONNECTIONS

Within Winslow city limits: **\$1,600.00****

Outside Winslow city limits: **\$2,600.00****

**Includes the meter deposit (see Meter Deposits below), transfer fees if any, connection fee, paying for standard labor related costs. The customer will be responsible for any charges for materials and supplies that may occur beyond the standard meter hook-up items, and connection fees.

METER DEPOSITS:

\$175.00 Property/Homeowners, **\$275.00** Renters, if someone other than the property owner is residing in the home and paying the property owner to live on the property, the \$275.00 deposit must be paid by either the property owner or renter **prior** to the water being turned on. Otherwise, the property stays in the owner's name. The property owner must have a deposit on file. The property owner is responsible for any unpaid balances or damage to Water System property.

METER USAGE FEE:

\$10.00 — all payments post marked or received after the **20th** of each month will be assessed a **\$10.00 late fee**.

Water bills must be paid in full before a new customer can take over an account.

Standard 3/4-inch¹ residential meter connected to the Winslow Water System. ¹Applications for other than standard 3/4-inch residential meter connections must be negotiated with Winslow City Council during a normal City Council meeting.

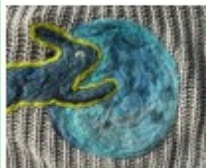

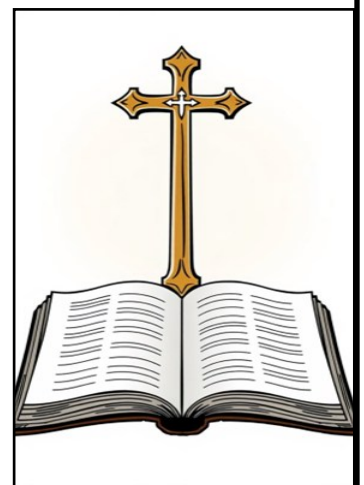
