

Winslow is considering applying to the Arkansas Economic Development Commission (AEDC) for Community Development Block Grant funds. Arkansas receives federal funds that are administered by AEDC, made available to cities and counties according to need.

The funds may be used for housing rehabilitation, community facilities, or economic development but must either: provide benefit to low and moderate income families; aid in the prevention of slum and blight; or meet other community needs which pose a serious immediate threat to the community's health or welfare where no other funding is available.

All local residents are encouraged to attend and participate in the community development process. Groups representing low and moderate income persons will be provided technical assistance in developing proposals.

**From City Hall & Winslow Water**

Thank you everyone for showing your small town Winslow Water Department some love by paying your water bill during the Covid-19 pandemic. We know times are tough, and it means a lot to us that people are helping us keep the water flowing in Winslow.

The lobby of City Hall/Winslow Water Department and the Winslow Museum will continue to be closed for the month of June, as the number of Covid-19 cases are currently at it's highest peak in Northwest Arkansas. Water bill payments can be mailed, or put into the door slot at City Hall. We are also encouraging our customers to drop payments in the old book deposit slot on the museum side of City Hall. This is more secure and sometimes easier to get an envelope into. If you need a receipt, please make a note of this with your payment and we will send you one. We are writing receipts for all cash payments. If you do not have exact change for a cash payment, we will debit or credit your account accordingly. You can also set up an account and make an online payment at [winslowar.com](http://winslowar.com), [winslowwater.com](http://winslowwater.com), or call the office at (479) 634-3901 to make a debit/credit card payment over the phone. Please be aware there is a \$2.50 service charge to the processing company to make a payment over the phone.

When making phone calls to City Hall/Water Department/Museum, please be mindful that most of our Winslow Water Company business, Winslow City business and many water payments are currently handled on one phone line, by one person. Our phone traffic has increased considerably because of the changes in our way of doing business during the covid-19 virus pandemic. Many people think life in the office is quiet and slow, but quite the contrary these days! We have around 650 water meters, with new customers moving in, a field crew of around 4 guys coming and going, stray dogs calls, and all the happenings of a growing little town. We appreciate your patience. If we don't answer the phone, please leave us a clear message and we will call you back. We are stepping outdoors to communicate with the field crew about work orders to maintain healthy social distancing, and are not always at the desk. Typically the office is closed Friday, Saturday and Sunday to give the building 72 hours to decontaminate before the next Customer Service Representative comes to work on Monday. **WINSLOW RECYCLING  
POSTPONED  
JUNE 6th AND JULY 4th**

Due to the corona virus pandemic and after consultation with Robyn Reed, Director of Boston Mountain Solid Waste (the company that provides our recycling truck and trailer) it has been decided to cancel the coming Winslow Recycling on Saturday, June 6th.

With so many folks gathering in close quarters (some without masks) and touching hard surfaces where the virus can linger for up to three days and transfer to other people, we thought it best to cancel this Saturday.

Director Reed also said that due to the holiday, the July 4th Winslow Recycling would also be cancelled.

So, the next Recycling session is tentatively set for August 1st! If you can't wait that long, the City of Fayetteville has several drop-off locations. The closest is at 1420 S. Happy Hollow Road in south Fayetteville, north on 71 and east at the old IGA for 2-3 miles on 15th St. Just past the 4-way stop, turn right when you see the purple roof of Quality Collision Repair. The Recycling Drop-Off is the next drive to the left.

Additional drop-off locations have been added. The drop-off sites, which will be available 24 hours a day, include:

- o Happy Hollow Recycling Drop-Off, located at 1420 S. Happy Hollow Road
- o Marion Orton Recycling Drop-Off, located at 735 W. North Street (now open 24 hours per day)
- o Boys and Girls Club, located at 560 N. Ruppel Road (source separated containers)
- o Gary Hampton Field, located at 2790 N. Salem Road (source separated containers)
- o Northwest Arkansas Mall, located at 4201 N. Shiloh Dr. (source separated containers)

# WINSLOW LOVED ONES WE HAVE LOST

## **Mark Wayne Corley**

Mark Wayne Corley, 71, of Winslow and Fayetteville died at his home on May 1, 2020. He was born in Gravette to Dr. Glenn P. Corley and Nina Pate Corley.

Mark was a graduate of The University of Arkansas Law School and was a retired Attorney. He practiced law with Ralph Williams Firm in Bentonville and later had his own practice in Rogers. For the past many years, Mark was a farmer and a vendor at Fayetteville Farmers' Market, selling native trees, plants, and pawpaws.

He was formerly a reporter for the Arkansas Gazette, a VISTA Volunteer, and a renowned stone mason who worked on many houses designed by architect Faye Jones. Mark was a founding member of the Weedy Rough Community and was a skilled carpenter and potter.

Mark had previously served as the chairman of The Board of Directors of Ozark Legal Services, and as a member of The Board of Directors of both the Washington County Equal Opportunity Agency and The Rural Mountain Producers Exchange. He served on The Bentonville Airport Commission, Fayetteville Historic District Commission, and Democrat Central Committees of both Washington and Benton Counties.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his brother Steve Corley, and his nephew Matthew Corley Malm.


Family will hold a private funeral service due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Burial will be in the Howell Cemetery in Hog Eye, Arkansas.

## Tips for Preventing Heat-Related Illness

### Stay Cool, Stay Hydrated, Stay Informed

#### Stay Cool

**Wear Appropriate Clothing:** Choose lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.

**Stay Cool Indoors:** Stay in an air-conditioned place as much as possible. If your home does not have air conditioning, go to the shopping mall or public library—even a few hours spent in air conditioning can help your body stay cooler when you go back into the heat. Call your local health department to see if there are any heat-relief shelters in your area.

**Keep in mind:** Electric fans may provide comfort, but when the temperature is in the high 90s, they will not prevent heat-related illness. Taking a cool shower or bath or moving to an air-conditioned place is a much better way to cool off. Use your stove and oven less to maintain a cooler temperature in your home. Schedule Outdoor Activities Carefully: Try to limit your outdoor activity to when it's coolest, like morning and evening hours. Rest often in shady areas so that your body has a chance to recover.

**Pace Yourself:** Cut down on exercise during the heat. If you're not accustomed to working or exercising in a hot environment, start slowly and pick up the pace gradually. If exertion in the heat makes your heart pound and leaves you gasping for breath, STOP all activity. Get into a cool area or into the shade, and rest, especially if you become lightheaded, confused, weak, or faint.

**Wear Sunscreen:** Sunburn affects your body's ability to cool down and can make you dehydrated. If you must go outdoors, protect yourself from the sun by wearing a wide-brimmed hat, sunglasses, and by putting on sunscreen of SPF 15 or higher 30 minutes prior to going out. Continue to reapply it according to the package directions.

**Tip:** Look for sunscreens that say “broad spectrum” or “UVA/UVB protection” on their labels- these products work best.

**Do Not Leave Children in Cars:** Cars can quickly heat up to dangerous temperatures, even with a window cracked open. While anyone left in a parked car is at risk, children are especially at risk of getting a heat stroke or dying. When traveling with children, remember to do the following:

**Never leave infants, children or pets in a parked car, even if the windows are cracked open.**

To remind yourself that a child is in the car, keep a stuffed animal in the car seat. When the child is buckled in, place the stuffed ani-

mal in the front with the driver.

When leaving your car, check to be sure everyone is out of the car. Do not overlook any children who have fallen asleep in the car.

**Avoid Hot and Heavy Meals:** They add heat to your body!

## Stay Hydrated

**Drink Plenty of Fluids:** Drink more fluids, regardless of how active you are. Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink.

Warning: If your doctor limits the amount you drink or has you on water pills, ask how much you should drink while the weather is hot.

**Stay away from very sugary or alcoholic drinks**—these actually cause you to lose more body fluid. Also avoid very cold drinks, because they can cause stomach cramps.

**Replace Salt and Minerals:** Heavy sweating removes salt and minerals from the body that need to be replaced. A sports drink can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat.

If you are on a low-salt diet, have diabetes, high blood pressure, or other chronic conditions, talk with your doctor before drinking a sports beverage or taking salt tablets.

**Keep Your Pets Hydrated:** Provide plenty of fresh water for your pets, and leave the water in a shady area.

## Stay Informed

**Check for Updates:** Check your local news for extreme heat alerts and safety tips and to learn about any cooling shelters in your area.

**Know the Signs:** Learn the signs and symptoms of heat-related illnesses and how to treat them.

**Use a Buddy System:** When working in the heat, monitor the condition of your co-workers and have someone do the same for you. Heat-induced illness can cause a person to become confused or lose consciousness. If you are 65 years of age or older, have a friend or relative call to check on you twice a day during a heat wave. If you know someone in this age group, check on them at least twice a day.

**Monitor Those at High Risk:** Although anyone at any time can suffer from heat-related illness, some people are at greater risk than others:

Infants and young children  
People 65 years of age or older  
People who are overweight  
People who overexert during work or exercise  
People who are physically ill, especially with heart disease or high blood pressure, or who take certain medications, such as for depression, insomnia, or poor circulation

Visit adults at risk at least twice a day and closely watch them for signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Infants and young children, of course, need much more frequent watching.

## HAVE YOU FORGOTTEN THE SCARS?

One of the South's greatest Civil War Generals was John B. Gordon of Georgia. He entered the army as a private and rose through the ranks to become a Lt. General at age 32. At Antietam, Gordon was horribly wounded — shot twice in the leg, in the shoulder and in the face. He bore the scars for the rest of his life.

Years after the war, Gordon ran for the U.S. Senate. One of his political opponents was a man who had served under him, but was now determined to see Gordon defeated. U.S. Senators were then elected by the legislature. The veteran stood up to cast his vote against his old commander. He saw Gordon seated there, his once handsome face disfigured by scars. Memory came flooding back and tears coursed down his cheeks. Turning to observers the veteran said: *"It's no use, boys, I can't do it... I had forgotten the scars..."*

Many who once marched with Jesus have forgotten His scars... They live heedless that He was *"wounded for our transgressions and bruised for our iniquities!"* Remembering should affect the way we look at ourselves and at others! But how do we "remember"??

**1) In Conversion.** The scars of Jesus demand Obedience. (*Hebrews 5.8-9.*) We identify with His scars in Baptism! Paul asks, *"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death?"* (*Romans 6.3.*) In baptism, we recreate by faith his death, burial and resurrection in our own lives.

**2) In Communion.** In the Lord's Supper we consciously declare our solidarity with Jesus. This is what the Lord's Supper is about! *"For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death..."* (*1 Corinthians 11.26.*) Partaking of the Supper should remind us of what He has done for us. When the it becomes mere mechanical repetition it is a sure sign we have forgotten the scars!

**3) In Consecration.** Properly considered, the scars of Jesus provide powerful incentives for living a Christ-like life. *"For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded... that they who live should no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf."* (*2 Cor. 5.14-15.*) What is wrong with our corrupt, defiled, degenerate world? People have forgotten the scars!
