The New G.I.S. Maps of Winslow and Area at City Hall Need Your Input

There are new 36" x 48" geographic information system (G.I.S.) maps of Winslow and region—just completed by professional cartographer Kristian Underwood of Winslow—which will be up in City Hall for the next couple months for people to look over and to help us identify commonly-known names of mountains, creeks, falls, cemeteries, churches, towns, very old trees, notable and/or historic buildings, etc.

These maps were part of a grant in August to Winslow from the Beaver Watershed Alliance (with funds from Arkansas Forestry Commission) to provide us with an updated and detailed look at our area, including known names of places, features and sites. These maps—one of the city of Winslow and one of Winslow and the region from West Fork to Lake Ft. Smith—will help us be ready for future grants, planning, and green projects like perhaps one day connecting the Razorback Greenway from Bentonville through Winslow on its way south.

Kristian Underwood, owner of Underwood Geographics, is a renowned cartographer, having recently completed the mapping of the 165 mile long Ozark Highland Trail.

So, come on down to City Hall 9 AM - 3 PM Mondays through Fridays—or—during the Christmas Parade on Saturday, December 10 to see the new Winslow City and Winslow area maps...and maybe even to help us identify an unmarked mountain or stream or...


Winslow removed nearly half an acre of invasive kudzu from Tunnel Park earlier this year, now they need our help to dig out the crowns. Please join us!
