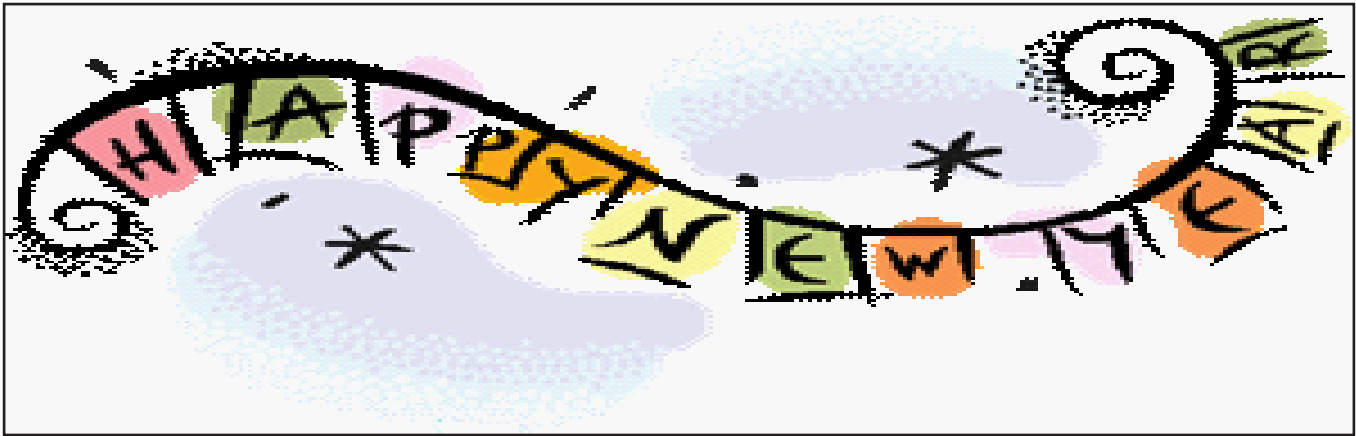

"Winslow Water Department Guidelines For Unpaid Water Bills"

Hello Winslow Water System Customers! Thank you for being patient with us as we navigate some staffing changes. If you ever have any questions about your water bill or water service, please feel to contact us at (479) 634-3901 or cityofwinslowar@gmail.com. If you are having difficulty paying your water bill, please contact us. We will work with you the best we can. We just ask that you pay something on your water bill each month and attempt to keep the balance at zero.

The following are the guidelines we will be using to make decisions on unpaid water bills. We are a small water company and it is important that our customers pay their water bill in a timely manner. We sincerely thank you for paying your water bill.

1. **Accounts that have a past due balance of greater than \$100.00 will be sent a shut-off notice.**
2. **Accounts that have not had a payment made on them in the past 60 days and have a past due balance will be sent a shut-off notice.**
3. **If a customer cannot pay all the outstanding balance on an account, they need to pay a minimum of 25% of the outstanding balance in addition to their new bill. Then continue to pay this amount until the old bill is paid in full.**
4. **The customer must sign a payment plan agreement in order to have a payment plan**
5. **Rental property water bills are due by the 20th with no exceptions unless we have a written OK from the property owner.**
6. **If a meter is pulled due to non-payment, the charge to re-install is \$250.00 plus all outstanding balances.**
7. **Late fees will be charged on all accounts with an unpaid balance of \$10.00 or more. The only exception to this is on accounts that have had a leak and we will work out a payment plan for the people to pay off the leak.**
8. **If a lock is placed on the water meter for non-payment, and the lock is cut off by the customer, the customer will be charged with destruction of city property. The customer will also pay for the cost of the lock that was cut off, and if the meter is damaged by the customer, the customer will pay \$250 for a new meter before water is turned back on.**

Sales & Use Tax and the City of Winslow – TOWN HALL – FEB 4, 2019

Recently the City adopted two Ordinances (2019-06 and 2019-07 available at City Hall) in order to put a vote for a 2% Sales and Use Tax on the **March 3, 2020** ballot before the registered voters living within the City of Winslow. Why is this important and would it make a difference for the City? It is up to you to decide if it is important and makes a potential difference for the City. This article hopes to provide some information that may be helpful as you make your decision.

Question 1: Would the Sales & Use Tax impact your property taxes? NO.

Question 2: How would the Sales and Use Tax impact me? This is a Sales and Use Tax, so any purchases at any retailer that you shop at within the Winslow City limits would add an additional two cents to the current sales taxes you are paying starting July 1, 2020. It could impact your sales tax slightly if you shop on the internet. However, for comparison, if you were to go into a Dollar General in any of the following cities to buy a candy bar for a dollar, with the various cities sales tax, here is what you would pay:

City	City Sales Tax Rate	Cost of Candy Bar with Sales Tax State (6.5%) Co (1.25%) and City
Winslow	Current – 0%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.08 (7.75%)
Winslow	Requested – 2%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.10 (9.75%)
Fayetteville	2.0%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.10 (9.75%)
West Fork	3.0%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.11 (10.75%)
Greenland	3.0%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.11 (10.75%)
Elkins	2.75%	\$1.00 w/all taxes = \$1.11 (10.50%)

Basically, it means that for every dollar spent in Winslow at the Dollar General, Mikey’s, or any other store would be benefiting Winslow in many ways. Most of those “pennies” are generated by people living outside the city limits or just passing through.

Question 3: How much could the City of Winslow be getting back annually? According to the Arkansas Department of Finance Administration, during 2018, over \$30,000.00 in sales tax was raised in the City of Winslow by the local retailers. Our first year will be for only a six-months revenue period; however, after that it will double. We budget annually and every dollar helps.

Question 4: What would the City use the money for? There are numerous on-going projects that the City is currently working on plus there is always maintenance. Below are some examples:

Restoration of Flood Damaged Areas: including the Ball Park (playground equipment, concession stand), City Hall (holes in roof and walls), Museum (carpeting), Bridges, and Water Line Repairs	FEMA will assist the City in some major repairs but only at the rate of 75% of our costs.	That means the City has to pay in full for the repair; then FEMA will reimburse the City for 75% of the cost of the repair. For example, the Morning Shade bridge cost the City \$10,000 for emergency repairs. The maximum FEMA will pay the City back will be \$7,500.00.
Water Department	Infrastructure from the 1980’s requires repairs and replacements.	Meters, pumps, and pipes are aged and need to be replaced. Current budget can begin to cover costs.
Streets	Infrastructure requires general repairs.	Source of income is from the State Turn-back and it does not cover annual repair costs.
Parks	Low Water Bridge needed at Ball Park.	Working with ARDOT but the City would most likely have to pay 50% of the cost.

The Search for Hidden Water Meters!

Hello Winslow Water Customers! Thank you for your patience and assistance in helping our new water meter readers find your water meter. Here in the Ozarks, finding a water meter can be quite challenging. With all the leaves on the ground, it can be like an Easter egg hunt to find the water meters during meter reading time! Please be mindful of where your water meter box is located and keep it uncovered so the meter reader can find it. We know you can't really keep the leaves off of it, but make sure it doesn't get covered with driveway dirt/gravel, kitty litter, construction materials, the camper, etc... We want to get an accurate meter reading each month so if there happens to be a leak, we can detect it early. If we have to estimate your meter reading, the system sometimes estimates high, so it is to your advantage that we can find and get to your water meter. We appreciate your help with this. 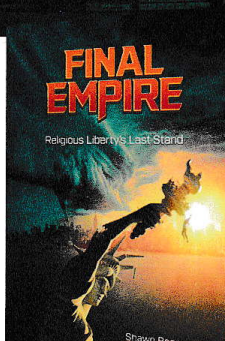

THE DAYS SPEAK

In the Book of Job we find this significant statement. *"I said, Days should speak, and multitude of years should teach wisdom..."* (Job 32.7, KJV). There is a thought here which is especially appropriate for this time of year. The passing days should speak to us! We should learn from the past as we stand on the threshold of a New Year!

1) Time Is Fleeting... Life is brief and uncertain. In the Bible, life is compared to a watch in the night, (Psalm 90), the flight of a bird, (Job 9.26) and a flickering candle. (Job 18.6.) James asks pointedly, *"For what is your life?"* and then answers just as pointedly, *"You are just a vapor that appears for a little while and then vanishes away."* (James 4.14). The old year is past; This should remind us of the brevity of life.

2) We Must Live One Day At A Time... Life is a tapestry woven of contrasting threads of joy and sorrow. In every life there is both sunshine and rain. We must remember when dark days come that they are not the whole of life... better days will follow. Many make the tragic mistake of trying to put off today until tomorrow; others make the equally tragic mistake of trying to live tomorrow today! Jesus urged. *"Therefore do not be anxious for tomorrow; for tomorrow will care for itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own."* (Matthew 6.34).

3) Tolerance and Forgiveness Are Essential... The passing days should remind us of our personal imperfections, frailties and weaknesses.
