Council Corner

June 2023

Spring has sprung in our verdant city, bringing the usual need for yard work and spring cleaning. City employees, including Mayor Jarnagan, have been busy weed eating and trimming brush on city properties and rights of way. Our annual bulky waste cleanup contract with Trash-A-Way removed several trailer loads of household trash.

Also, city employees and volunteers, under the guidance of Council Member Ken Stout, spent three days in May clearing brush off the Tunnel Park hill to allow Nate Weston from Beaver Watershed Alliance to target-spray the spreading kudzu vines. The vines have been threatening to cover and kill the trees, including dozens of saplings planted there several years ago.

We're continuing implementation of our Water System Improvement Plan by replacing old meters with remote-read meters. This will allow our water techs to read meters faster, so they have more time to address leaks and other problems. The project is funded, in part, by American Rescue Plan Act and a grant from the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission.

Winslow residents who need help paying current and/or past-due water bills may qualify for assistance through the Arkansas Low Income Household Water Assistance Program at ArkansasLIH-WAP.com.

We'll look forward to seeing everyone at the Independence Day Fireworks Show on Tuesday, July 4th at sundown at the ballpark.

Also, all residents are invited to visit City Hall and Winslow Museum during Saturday morning Coffee Klatch gatherings during the Farmers Market and are welcome to attend City Council meetings on third Mondays at 6pm.

March 5, 1936~May 12, 2023

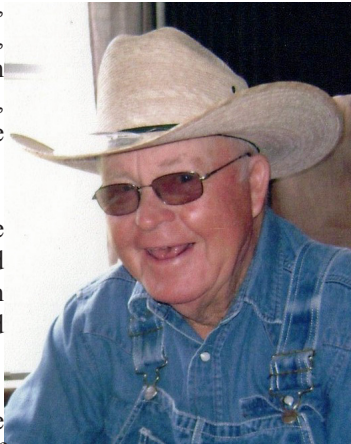

No services are scheduled.

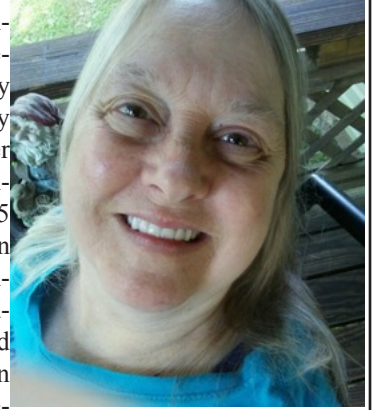

\$100 for the cafeteria + a \$100 cleaning deposit

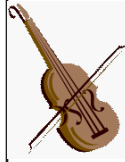

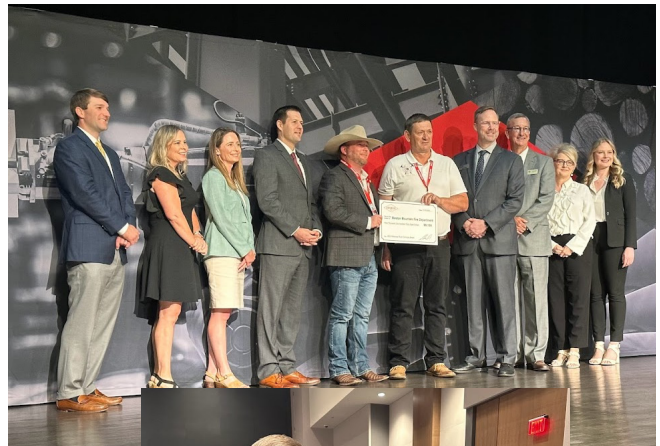
Boston Mountain Fire Department

7 Signs of Jesus Soon Return

**The Seventh sign I want you to think about is:
Lovelessness!**

Jesus for told, “ And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold”. (Matthew 24:12). And Paul warned, “This know also, that in the last days perilous times shall come. For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous, boasters, proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, without natural affection, trucebreakers, false accusers, incontinent, fierce, despisers of those that are good, Traitors, heady, high-minded, lovers of pleasures more than lovers of God;” (1 Timothy 3:1-4)

Perhaps this sign of the times, more than any other, has slid into sharp focus for the Christian in this generation. Between 1870 and 1970, the divorce rate in North America quadrupled. From cancel culture to hate crime, today’s society has made it clear that it is fostering division, contempt and entitlement. There professed Christians who believe social media gives them license to bully, gossip, and demean. Sure it is easy to love someone who loves you back, but what about those who don’t treat you well, who aren’t that likeable, or with whom you simply have a disagreement of opinion?

Real true love is disappearing--- and it is about to get worse. As we previously mentioned, the Bible predicts terrible persecution on God’s people, “that the image of the beast should both speak and cause as many as would not worship the beast to be killed” (Revelation 13:15) This extreme hatred will only intensify until the Second Coming of Christ ends it. Jesus said “Indeed the hour is coming when whoever kills you will think he is offering service to God John 16:2.
