RECYCLE THOSE SPENT PRINTER CARTRIDGES AND CELL PHONES

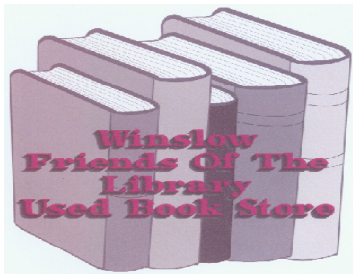
Barbara Ashbaugh will collect used printer cartridges and cell phones on recycling day the first Saturday of every month.

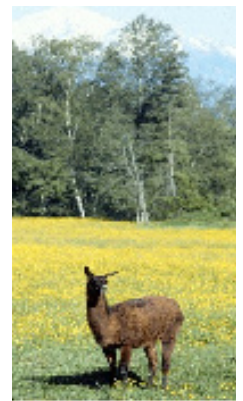

Hope everyone can come and join us for our Dinosaur Hunt this month...

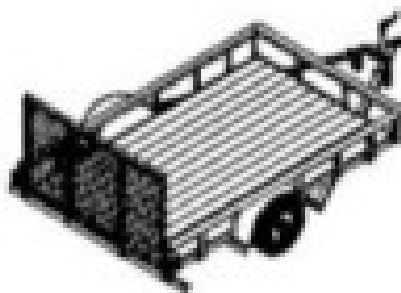
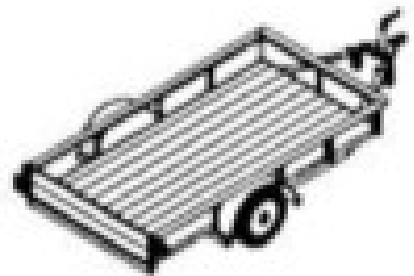

Everything Old is New Again

Batman, Spiderman, and the X-Men: great new movies. But these and myriads of other old movies and television shows are just being remade for today's audiences. Those clothes you threw out after you graduated from college...if only you had them now they would fit right in with today's new fashions. Sky-Vue Lodge even has a new lounge and gift shop floor. Well it really is not new but just new to us.

Many of the long time Winslow residents remember Blocky Riddle and the story starts with him. In about 1940 Blocky built his family a new home on US 71 across from the apple orchard south of town. He was a very busy man so the home was not completely finished when they moved in. Blocky's daughter Vera Jean Harrison-Rhodes said, "We walked around and stepped over stacks of hardwood flooring for about two years before daddy had a chance to lay the new floor." For the next sixteen years the family enjoyed the beautiful hardwood floor that Blocky worked so hard to provide for their new home.

Over the years the property changed hands several times until three years ago it was purchased by Aaron and Audrey Wood. They had hoped to remodel this house into their very own first home. It wasn't to be though as the house was just too far gone to make a renovation financially feasible. When we, their neighbors at Sky-Vue, learned what was to become of the house we asked to buy the old flooring for use in a renovation of the main lodge and a cabin.

December of 2006 was filled with days on our knees carefully removing 65-year-old strips of hardwood flooring. Early in January we cut off nails, sorted, stacked, and packed 20 large boxes of oak. February found us back on our knees pounding the nails back in! By early March the floor was down and refinished. Now nearly four months and hundreds of man-hours later we are

glad to have spent the effort to use the used flooring. It looks like it has always belonged at Sky-Vue. If you have not been to Sky-Vue for a while come on up to visit and gaze at our beautiful new floor while we put the gift shop back together.

The old hardwood flooring is not the only item from the "Riddle Place" that is being reused and renewed. When the house is torn down later this spring the rocks from the chimney will end up at Vera Jean "Riddle's" current home just down the road. Chuck and Vera Jean plan on using them for a flower garden at "Rancho Milpa Alta." Their house has an old name, too. That, as they say though, is a story for another day. One last note of interest with an ironic twist; sometime in the late 1960's or early 70's Col. Buttolph, who owned Sky-Vue Lodge at the time, paid for a tractor repair with... a big stack of used hardwood flooring!

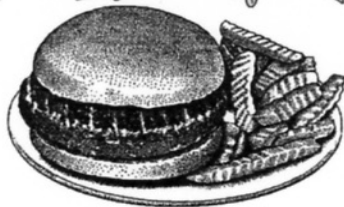
