



Summary of Resolution No. 2024-003
A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE WATER SYSTEM RATES FOR THE CITY OF WINSLOW, ARKANSAS, BEGINNING THE JULY/AUGUST 2024 WATER BILL CYCLE; PRESCRIBING OTHER MATTERS PERTAINING THERETO; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WATER RATES

- \$49.00 minimum for the first 1,000 gallons
- \$11.00 per 1,000 gallons - 1,001-4,000 gallons
- \$18.50 per 1,000 gallons – 4,001-35,000 gallons
- \$25.00 per 1,000 gallons – 35,001-39,999 gallons*
- \$46.00 per 1,000 gallons for non-metered customers
- *Leaks: \$630.00 for the first 40,000 gallons plus \$10.50 for every 1,000 gallons over the 40,001.
- Plus, current sales taxes***:
 - State: 6.50%
 - Washington Co.: 1.25%
 - Crawford Co. 1.25%
 - Winslow 2.00%

METER / SECURITY and HOOK-UP CONNECTIONS

Within Winslow city limits: \$1,200.00**
 Outside Winslow city limits: \$2,200.00**
 **Includes the new meter deposit (see Meter Deposits below), transfer fees if any, connection fee, paying for standard labor related costs. The customer will be responsible for any charges for materials and supplies that may occur beyond the standard meter hook-up items, and connection fees.

METER DEPOSITS:

\$ 150.00 Property/Homeowners, \$250.00 Renters (as of January 1, 2022, if someone other than the property owner is residing in the home and paying the property owner to live on the property, the \$250.00 deposit must be paid by either the property owner or renter prior to the water being turned on. Otherwise, the property stays in the owner's name. The property owner must have a deposit on file. The property owner is responsible for any unpaid balances or damages to Water System property.

OTHER FEES:

- \$20.00 Turn on or Transfer Fees
- \$20.00 Non-Payments tum back on

METER USAGE FEE:

\$2.00 per month added to the water bill of each household or business.

LATE FEES:

\$10.00 — all payments post marked or received after the 20th of each month will be assessed a \$10.00 late fee.
 Water bills must be paid in full before a new customer can take over an account.

Standard 2-inch residential meter connected to the Winslow Water System. 1Applications for other than standard 2-inch residential meter connections must be negotiated with Winslow City Council during a normal City Council meeting.

The updated rates required by the increase in the City of Fort Smith’s 40% water rate increase will be reflected on the August water bill.

The above Resolution was adopted by the Winslow City Council on July 15, 2024.

As reported last month, Ft Smith Water raised their water rates and since we are on the Ft Smith Water System our rates also increased. This is the newest rate schedule. There is the possibility of another increase in January but Ft. Smith Water has not voted on that at this time.

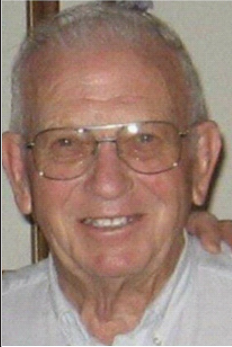

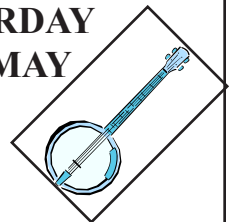

Winslow Museum

In the March 23rd 1989 issue of the Washington County Observer Robert Winn wrote an article entitled "A Plea to Save Old Materials, Pictures".

In this article, he made a plea: "**NEVER, but NEVER throw away anything you find when cleaning out the belongings of deceased relatives, strangers, or anytime you have access to what you consider worthless items, especially written material or pictures**".

If entrusted to clean out the house of your parents, grandparents, or members of previous generations when they have passed or moved to an assisted living facility, old pictures, old school books, autograph books, letters, scrapbooks, news clippings, things they saved for years may be meaningless to you but to a historian or a museum, it could be a treasure.

If you move into an old house with "stuff" in the attic or in a closet, do not pitch it until you find out if it has historical value. In his article, Robert Winn cited several cases where they pitched irreplaceable pictures and old school books before they called him about a particular item. In one situation, a picture of the Countryside Hotel that Robert had never seen before was saved from a fire that had already burned several other old pictures and papers. If it pertains to the area surrounding Winslow, before destroying anything like that, call the Winslow Museum to see if it has any historical value. If it were something you want to keep perhaps, you would be willing to share it with us. We would gladly make a copy along with any story you have about it and give you the credit.

If it is from other parts of Washington County check with Shiloh Museum.

In Robert's words, "**Again we plead, Please do not throw away any old pictures or written material before giving us an opportunity to see them.**"

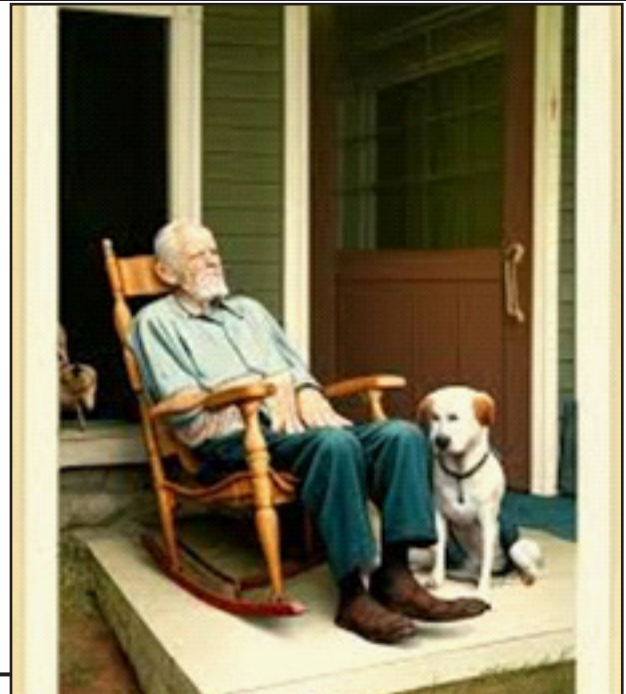
