Winslow Plantings Group Needs Volunteers

You may have noticed in recent years the plantings and flowers that have been appearing around the city. You see them in the barrels that line the sidewalk in front of City Hall and Mercantile, to the native trees and flowers along Squirrel Creek in Peek's Park across the tracks, and from the Welcome Rock garden at the Y, to the rain garden and stone planter at the ballpark.

And you may have wondered "who planted these?"
Well, some are plantings already in place. Others include major projects funded by grants from Beaver Watershed Alliance and Watershed Conservation Resource Center that, for example, reconstructed the eroding banks and stream bed of Squirrel Creek and planted native plants to prevent erosion while also attracting native insects, birds, and animals

And you may have wondered "who does 'Winslow Arbor Day and Native Seedling Giveaway' every March?"

And, finally, you may have questioned "who takes care of these plants?" Now, we're talking! It's **our volunteers** who plant, maintain, and water them.

Interested? So, now is when you get in touch with someone who is connected with the Winslow beautification group, which includes the Winslow Tree Board and the Winslow plantings group, both supported by the City of Winslow. Currently, our members include a Master Gardener and a professional arborist, and there is a lot to learn from them!

City Council Corner

Blooming flowers and singing birds mean it's time for Spring cleaning! The annual Winslow waste pick-up will be Monday, May 5th. Residents within city limits should have household trash items at the street no later than Sunday night. The pickup will not include construction materials, large furniture, or hazardous materials like batteries, paint, or tires. There's a trailer at the school until the 5th for large, non-hazardous items like couches.

On May 3rd, we'll celebrate the centennial of the all-woman Winslow City Council, which was the second so-called Petticoat Government in the United States. Starting at 10:30, the festivities downtown will include a parade, historic re-enactments, live music, and a cake and ice cream social.

Your city officials continue to improve the Winslow Water System. A low-interest, partially forgivable loan from the Arkansas Natural Resources Commission Clean Water Revolving Loan Fund will help fund a second water tank by the one on Mt. Gayler to relieve pressure during power outages, provide additional water as needed, and allow uninterrupted service during cleaning and maintenance of the existing tank. A \$500,000 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) from the Arkansas Community and Economic Development Program is funding installation of a secondary tank next to our backflow tank.

We have authorized construction work at the Winslow Water Department building so that the building and restroom will be accessible to all.

Everyone is invited to Saturday morning Coffee Klatch gatherings at City Hall and, when the weather is good, to the Saturday Farmers Market downtown from 8:30 to 11:30. Everyone is also welcome to attend City Council meetings on third Mondays at 6pm either in person at City Hall, or via WebEx online. Visit WinslowAR.com for more information.



The Spiritual Pen

From The Voice Of One On The Top Of Brentwood Mountain!

From the Voice of One On Top of Brentwood Mt.

Revelation14:6,7 And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people, Saying with a loud voice, Fear God, and give glory to him; for the hour of his judgment is come: and worship him that made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and the fountains of waters.

Chap. 29 - The Origin of Evil. Continuing on starting with (Pg. 493.2)

But there was one that chose to pervert this freedom. Sin originated with him who, next to Christ, had been most honored of God and who stood highest in power and glory among the inhabitants of heaven. Before his fall, Lucifer was first of the covering cherubs, holy and undefiled. "Thus saith the Lord God; Thou sealest up the sum, full of wisdom, and perfect in beauty. Thou hast been in Eden the garden of God; every precious stone was thy covering. . . .Thou art the anointed cherub that covereth; and I have set thee so: thou wast upon the holy mountain of God; thou hast walked up and down in the midst of the stones of fire. Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in thee." Ezekiel 28:12-15. {GC 493.3}

Lucifer might have remained in favor with God, beloved and honored by all the angelic host, exercising his noble powers to bless others and to glorify his Maker. But, says the prophet, "Thine heart was lifted up because of thy beauty, thou hast corrupted thy wisdom by reason of thy brightness." Verse 17. Little by little, Lucifer came to indulge a desire for self-exaltation. "Thou hast set thine heart as the heart of God." "Thou hast said, . . . I will exalt my throne above the stars of God: I will sit also upon the mount of the congregation....I will ascend above the heights of the clouds; I will be like the Most High." Verse 6; Isaiah 14:13, 14. Instead of seeking to make God supreme in the affections and allegiance of His creatures, it was Lucifer's endeavor to win their service and homage to himself. And coveting the honor which the infinite Father had bestowed upon His Son, this prince of angels aspired to power which it was the prerogative of Christ alone to wield. {GC 494.1}

All heaven had rejoiced to reflect the Creator's glory and to show forth His praise. And while God was thus honored, all had been peace and gladness. But a note of discord now marred the celestial harmonies. The service and exaltation of self, contrary to the Creator's plan, awakened forebodings of

evil in minds to whom God's glory was supreme. The heavenly councils pleaded with Lucifer. The Son of God presented before him the greatness, the goodness, and the justice of the Creator, and the sacred, unchanging nature of His law. God Himself had established the order of heaven; and in departing from it, Lucifer would dishonor his Maker, and bring ruin upon himself. But the warning, given in infinite love and mercy, only aroused a spirit of resistance. Lucifer allowed jealousy of Christ to prevail, and he became the more determined. {GC 494.2}

Pride in his own glory nourished the desire for supremacy. The high honors conferred upon Lucifer were not appreciated as the gift of God and called forth no gratitude to the Creator. He gloried in his brightness and exaltation, and aspired to be equal with God. He was beloved and reverenced by the heavenly host. Angels delighted to execute his commands, and he was clothed with wisdom and glory above them all. Yet the Son of God was the acknowledged Sovereign of heaven, one in power and authority with the Father. In all the councils of God, Christ was a participant, while Lucifer was not permitted thus to enter into the divine purposes. "Why," questioned this mighty angel, "should Christ have the supremacy? Why is He thus honored above Lucifer?" {GC 495.1}
