

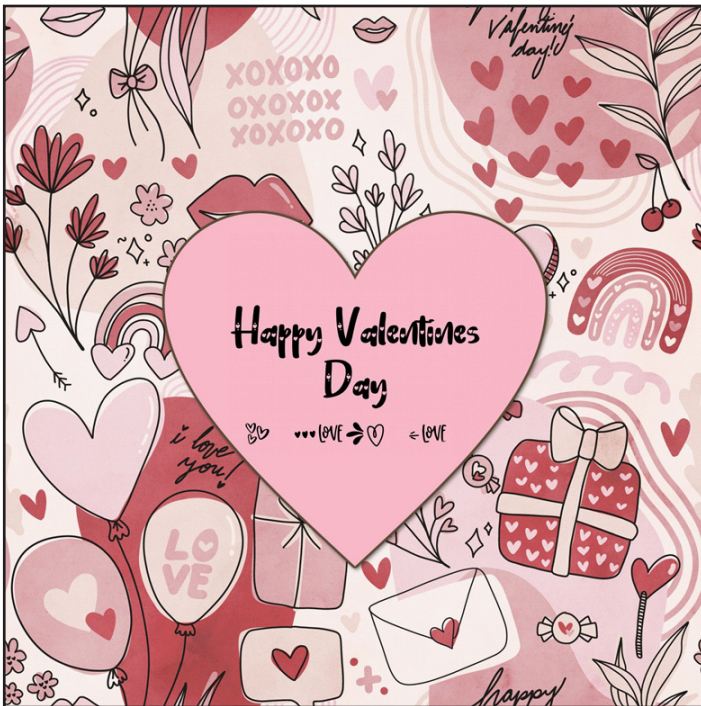

Each council member and our mayor began new terms in office last month, having been elected without opposition in November. We have a really good team working to help Winslow government work for all residents.

Our Water System techs continue to fix leaks and replace meters to make our system better. We have also applied for some low interest/forgivable loans to help fund our Water Improvement Plan. The sales tax that voters approved two years ago brought the city \$108,971 last year that we're using for various projects.

We owe huge thanks to the WWS crew and our mayor who were out in the snow and ice again in January to try to keep residential and City pipes from bursting in cold temperatures.

The council adopted the City of Winslow Personnel Manual in January to help all City employees, including Council members, know the procedures and rules we're expected to follow while working in Winslow government.

As a member of Tree City USA, we're looking forward to our annual Arbor Day celebration and tree giveaway downtown on March 4th.

The City will be hiring someone part-time to do weedeating and other similar seasonal responsibilities in late March/early Spring depending on weather. Applications are available at City Hall.

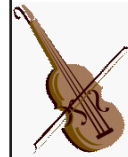

#### The Third sign I want you to think about is: The Environmental Crisis

On May 13, 2021, the world’s largest iceberg was formed when it broke off the Ronne Ice Shelf in Antarctica. A76, as it was named, is a whopping 1,670 square miles.

No doubt, the earth is changing. Science attributes the environmental crisis to such factors as global warming, loss of biodiversity, or pollution, the Bible explains the root of the problem as another sign of the end: In his vision of the final judgment, the prophet Isaiah recorded, in Isaiah 24:5 “The earth also is defiled under the inhabitants thereof; because they have transgressed the laws, changed the ordinance, broken the everlasting covenant.

Isaiah 24:6 Therefore hath the curse devoured the earth, and they that dwell therein are desolate: Furthermore, the prophet John in his vision of end times, heard proclaimed from heaven that God would “Destroy those who destroy the earth” (Revelation 11:18). The earth is breaking down because humanity has persistently broken God’s law. There may well come a day when the devil will twist this reasoning to convince the majority of the globe to follow a counterfeit law of God.

In 2015, Pope Francis published his second encyclical, entitled Laudato si’, widely considered to be the pontiff’s opus on environmental protection. The issue has, in fact, been called the “cornerstone of his pontificate.” Francis has been instrumental in propelling climate change into a global movement, largely in his effort to unite church and state under its banner. At no other time in history has a church been so impassioned about environmentalism.

Though we have not been given license to treat our planet like trash, there is danger of making environmentalism your gospel. The fact of the matter is that we cannot save the world with solar panels, wind turbines, or hybrid cars. “But the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night; in which the heavens shall pass away with a great noise, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up.”(2Peter 3:10). It is Christ who saves the world. Ultimately, the Savior will “create new heavens and a new earth” (Isaiah 65:17), restoring the earth to perfection.
