Chris Allen won the wooden train set carved by Fred Derwin and raffled off by the Winslow Home Extension cluh.



Leonard Quentin Skelton

January 13, 1921 - December 2, 2015



L. Quentin Skelton, 94, of Spring-dale died Wednesday, December 2, 2015, at Northwest Medical Center in Springdale. He was born on January 13, 1921, in Black Oak near Winslow, Arkansas to Henry Eli and Priscilla Fay Anderson Skelton.

Mr. Skelton married Alice Marie Wilson of Hazel Valley on April 17, 1943. He joined the United States Army in December of 1942. He served in World War II in the 43rd Tank Battalion of the 12th Armored Division in Europe and hauled ammunition and fuel to the front lines and prisoners back

to the supply line. Mr. Skelton and his brothers established Skel-

ton Brothers, Inc. in June of 1951 and hauled Grade A milk from farm to market in tank trailers. In 1956, they established Skelton Motor Company. He also operated G&H Bandag Company, Inc., Jeanway Industries, Inc., and S&H Parts & Equipment. Skelton Brothers Inc. also manufactured and delivered Boston Mountain Ice within a 100-mile radius of Springdale. In 1987, Mr. Skelton and his sons established Skelton Reload.

Mr. Skelton was preceded in death by his brothers Donald Skelton, Keith Skelton, Arthur Skelton and Lawrence Skelton, and four sisters, Delia Stephens, Blanch Wolfenbarger, Louise Gillespie and Naomi Bradley.

He is survived by his wife of 72 years, Marie Skelton; two sons, James D. and Mary Ann Skelton and Ronnie and Linda Skelton, both of Springdale; two daughters, Jacque and Norman Long and Shirley and Rick Jackson, both of Edmond, OK; one sister, Rose Wagner of Tulsa, Oklahoma; two brothers, Pierson Skelton of Dutch Mills, AR and Dwain Skelton of Easton, Kansas. He is also survived by 13 grandchildren and spouses and 18 great grandchildren.

Visitation will be held 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m., Friday, December 4, 2015 at Moore's Chapel. Funeral service will be held 10:00 a.m., Saturday, December 5 at First United Methodist Church in Springdale followed by burial at Black Oak Cemetery, under the direction of Moore's Chapel. It appears that Arkansas has not been excluded in the bat problem known as Geomyces-destructans – the white nose fungus syndrome that initially became noticeable in 2006. Approaching a cave not too far in distance from the cavern, a few years ago, I observed a couple of bats flying around as if in a daze, one early morn. The sun had already begun to rise and the bat should have already been inside some structure.

The "fungus amongst us" is not the only fungus that has materialized hurting a certain species.

Cryphonectria parasitica, a fungus, destroyed virtually all of the American chestnut trees. So, what do we lose if we lose our bat population? One million bats can eat up to 700 tons of insects in a year's time period! During winter months, bats hibernate and their metabolism steps down a notch or two. Losing a month's worth of fat, due to a fungus, may destroy the bat. Thus insects not eaten multiply to an alarming rate of existence. Initially, it seemed that the brown bat was the most endangered of the species. Since the bat hibernates in the winter, he or she uses up the stored fat and then loses energy to feed itself properly if need be. Death is certain for this bat.

Bats do not merely eat insects; they pollinate flowers and scatter seed. The "little Brown Bat" is not bigger than a human's thumb and stores up just about two grams of fat for hibernation. Without certain bat species mankind itself may indeed experience more than merely an explosion of insects on the horizon. Prices at the grocery store won't go sky-high just because of any oil crisis.

Even though bats do not appear in the cavern, the rule of thumb is not to enter any caves period. That's the way the law reads and since the government of the land proclaims such a law only the government can supposedly can supposedly change it at any given interval.

We know that our government works, sometimes, in both a positive and negative arrangement to suit itself. There is always an argument of the greater needs of mankind in the reasoning of any initial action concerning any arrangement. One such example happened a few years back concerning the great state of Alaska. Early man searched for gold and other riches and today man continues to search. Man of yesteryear had a piece of land he called his own. The government came in and proclaimed "imminent domain" for the good of man as a whole. Today he does exactly the same thing. Yes sir, history repeats itself over and over. Many things went extinct in the past. Who knows what the future will bring?

Luke 11: 1 And it came to pass, that, as he was praying in a certain place, when he ceased, one of his disciples said unto him, Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.

After a warm welcome, introduction of this speaker, and as the applause quieted down he rose from his high back chair and walked slowly, with great effort and a sliding gate to the podium. Without a note or written paper of any kind he placed both hands on the pulpit to steady himself and then quietly and slowly he began to speak....

"When I was asked to come here today and talk to you, your pastor asked me to tell you what was the greatest lesson ever learned in my 50 odd years of preaching. I thought about it for a few days and boiled it down to just one thing that made the most difference in my life and sustained me through all my trials. The one thing that I could always rely on when tears and heart break and pain and fear and sorrow paralyzed me.....the only thing that would comfort was this verse.....

> "Jesus loves me this I know. For the Bible tells me so. Little ones to Him belong, we are weak but He is strong..... Yes, Jesus loves me... The Bible tells me so."

When he finished, the church was quiet. You actually could hear his footsteps as he shuffled back to his chair. I don't believe I will ever forget it. A pastor once stated.....

"I always noticed that it was the adults who chose the children's hymn 'Jesus Loves Me' (for the children of course) during a hymn sing, and it was the adults who sang the loudest because I could see they knew it the best."
