






Winslow Water Department News

Traffic in and out of the Winslow Water Department will continue to be limited to employees only, to decrease the opportunity for spread of the covid-19 virus. Please continue to mail or drop off payments to 108 N. Winslow Boulevard, Winslow, Arkansas, 72959. Please use the old book deposit on the Museum side of City Hall to drop off payments and correspondence. This is more secure, and we will be temporarily covering the door slot while flood damage repairs are being made to the building. The museum will be getting a new floor and we don't want water bill payments to slip under the museum furniture that will be stored in the lobby while working on the floor.

We really appreciate everyone who continues to budget for their water bill. We are a small water utility, so every little bit helps. If you cannot pay all of your water bill, please pay what you can. Call us at (479) 634-3901 for questions or a payment plan. If you move in or out of a house on our water system, please call us and let us know. Your water meter deposit is returned to you if you move.

Our Customer Service Representative, Terry, has retired for real! She's busy working in her woodworking shop, gardening and building the ultimate self contained gypsy wagon for new adventures with her husband Jim. We miss her. If you call the Water Department you may encounter a new employee taking her place. So please be patient and we will do our best to take good care of you!

We've also hired a couple of new part time employees, Jacob and James, to help with city maintenance and meter reading chores. They have been great help. So, if you see new faces reading your meter, it is probably them. If you ever have concerns as to whether or not the person reading your meter is actually a city employee, please call us. We are working some flex hours in our covid-19 world, but we will return your phone call ASAP if we are not at the phone when you call.

If you live within the Winslow city limits, you will notice the new 2% city sales tax added to the water bill you will get in the mail September 1st. As you know, this 2% tax was recently voted into existence to help the city with upkeep of our town.

The City Council also approved a 5% increase for water usage. We have not had an increase for a while and held out as long as we could. This increase will be apparent on the water bill you will get in the mail September 1st, 2020.

Thank you for support of your local water company. We miss seeing all of you and hope you are healthy.

The City Council and Administrator's have to make difficult decisions to keep the Winslow Water System financially sound. This is the first rate increase since 2018 and normally rates are raised annually. Copies of Resolution 2020-008 are posted in the Post Office and other key locations within the City.

RECYCLING RESUMES

SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 5th

Winslow Recycling will resume on Saturday, September 5th at the usual site across the tracks from City Hall on the edge of Peek's Park. Volunteers will not be present.

For this long-anticipated event, this list may help folks prepare for next month.

If it can't wait, recycling can be taken to 1420 S. Happy Hollow Rd. in south Fayetteville, N. on 71 and turn E. at the old IGA onto MLK (15thSt.), 2-3 mi, behind Quality Collision Repair.

It's open 7 days/wk, 24 hrs/day.

1. Due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, everyone will have to wear a mask and maintain at least 6 feet of physical distancing. Also, whether gloves are worn or not, everyone is advised to bring and use hand sanitizer afterwards.

2. Please rinse out (all food particles from) all cans, bottles, and plastics --or the entire contents of that bin and barrel may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

3. Please place materials (plastic bottles, steel cans, etc.) in the right bin and container--or the entire contents of the bin may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

4. LIST of accepted and clean recyclables:

IN THE BINS OF THE TRAILER:

--#1 See-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom. (ex: soda and water bottles, peanut butter jars, etc.)

--#2 Non see-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom (ex: milk and water jugs, etc.)

--#2 Colored and opaque—must have neck smaller than the bottom (ex: liquid detergent, shampoo, etc.) --NO margarine, yogurt, or other plastic tubs!

--Mixed paper and magazines (must be DRY)—printer paper, junk-mail, slick-coated paper, envelopes, etc. --NO paper plates or cups, milk or juice cartons, frozen, food containers, egg cartons, etc.

--Newspaper (incl. regular phone books)

--Steel cans

IN THE BARRELS:

--all colors of glass

--old fabric, belts, shoes, small toys

IN THE TRUCK:

--cardboard and brown grocery bags

IN THE PLASTIC BAGS ON GROUND TO LEFT OF THE TRAILER:
separate into two groups:

--aluminum soda and beer cans (to take for cash to Winslow Community Meals)

--clean aluminum pie plates, foil, cat food cans, etc. (for Winslow Community Meals)

SIX MISTAKES MEN MAKE

Recently *Max Patterson*, a fellow preacher, passed along a list of six mistakes that men make in life with his own added comments in parentheses.

1. *The delusion that individual advancement is made by crushing others down.* (Some have got to be in power, in charge. In the process they may crush their family, friends and the church. But, never mind. Doing what they want to do takes precedence over all else.)

2. *The tendency to worry about a thing that cannot be changed or corrected.* (There is an old saying: “If you can change things, don’t worry, change them. If you cannot change things, all the worry in the world will not help one iota.”)

3. *Insisting that a thing is impossible because we ourselves have not accomplished it.* (Sometimes if we would work together more, rather than by ourselves, and for our own glory, we could accomplish unbelievable things.)

4. *Refusing to set aside trivial preferences in order that important things may be accomplished.* (Some are so selfish, so judgmental, and so determined to have their own way that they refuse to cooperate for the greater good of the church.)

5. *Attempting to compel others to believe and live as we do.* (We are not the standard and particularly that is important in matters of human judgment.)

6. *The failure to establish the habit of saving money.* (Although the Scriptures say nothing about saving money, the emphasis is upon the future. Just as there are now many who are in trouble and in serious need because they did not save for the future, there will also be those in a heap of trouble at the judgment day because they did not save their soul.)

If the people of the world can see what is wrong with us, why cannot we also see it? It is time for us to count the cost, re-examine ourselves, and work together for the greater good.
