Do you qualify for ARChoice?

On Thursday, October 17, 2024, Winslow Community Meals will have a representative from Independence At Home Homecare, to assist in filling out ARChoice Medicaid Applications to see if you are eligible for the program.

Documents needed for the AR Choice Medicaid Application are:

1. 6 months of bank statements, checking and savings, including money cards, Direct Express, etc.
2. 2024 Social Security Benefit letter, Retirement, or pension.
3. 2024 personal property assessment on vehicle or home
4. ID/Driver's License, Social Security card, Medicare card, any supplemental insurance.
5. Marriage license or Divorce Degree (if applicable)
6. Any Life, Burial, or Prepaid Funeral Policies
7. Any Cash app, Pay Pal, Walmart Money Card, etc. 6 months of statements.

Only the documents that pertain to you need be brought in.
