Winslow Receives AEDC Rural Services Grant

The money is part of a \$4000 matching fund grant that will be used to purchase a portable, emergency power generator. The \$2000.00 matching funds were provided by Winslow Community Meals. The generator will be used for the City and Winslow Community Meals to provide power where it is needed most during power outages in Winslow.

Seems that we're skipping fall. We've gone from air conditioning to wood burning stove!

The Winslow Community Center's summer was focused on the pre-school and getting it renovated, and approved by the state, county, city, home owner's association. (Just kidding.) But it does seem like a never-ending jumping through hoops to get a certified pre-school in place.

And fall has brought many changes to the Association as well. Board member Liam Johnson did not seek re-election to his seat as his new employment hours did not coincide with the duties and responsibility of being a board member. The WCCA appreciates so much all that Liam brought to the table and we're delighted that he will continue to be a part of the Center as it continues growing and changing. Board member Beverly Simpson (no news to anyone) has moved down south where she didn't have snow on her roof this morning. On a personal note, I'm missing Beverly every day. She wasn't just an influential and integral part of the WCCA - she was an influential and integral part of most of Winslow. We wish

her the best and with great reluctance accepted her resignation from the WCCA board. Lastly, I have stepped down from my duties and responsibilities as the WCCA's secretary and unofficial director of the center. Serving the WCCA board and this community has been one of the most satisfying endeavors of my life and I am honored they allowed me to be a part of something so special.

Board elections were held on Saturday October 26th and members re-elected Julie Center Dilworth to her seat. Members elected Travis Carlin to the seat vacated by Liam Johnson. Beverly's seat still had one year before elections and the newly elected board appointed Carroll Snyder to complete her term. Officer elections were held by the Board. Gene Farris was re-elected as President, Carroll Snyder was elected as Vice President, Rick Reed was re-elected as Treasurer and Pamela Center will serve as the board's Secretary.

I plan on continuing in a limited capacity as a volunteer for public relations. I will not be issuing monthly articles to Within Winslow. We will publish anytime we have real news to share about the WCCA or the Center itself.

I have stressed to you over the last five years that there is no "Community Center without the Community". I had sincerely hoped that by this point we would have active community involvement. Some have stepped up, devoting countless hours and hundreds of dollars both in their skill and financial contributions. Many have come and expressed support in the "idea" of a community center. Some have participated in the events and taken advantage of the convenience of having a facility restored for their use.

But a majority of the community has contributed no sweat equity. I ask, as someone who has given hours of my time over the last few years but did not attend Winslow Schools, did not have children attending Winslow Schools, where are the alumni? Where are the people that actually have an emotional investment in the campus? Why are you not actively involved in helping fulfill this vision?

Our open board meetings are attended by the same few individu-

als. Our calls for volunteers are answered by the same few individuals.

Here's our truth. You may not want to hear it, but this is it.

The Winslow Community Center cannot continue without more community involvement. There are committees that need individuals to participate. There is still much work that needs to be done structurally. Money is always a major concern in a non-profit just getting on its feet or even trying to maintain a modicum of availability. The next board meeting will be on November 19 at 6pm. All citizens of the greater Winslow area are encouraged to attend. Join by paying a nominal annual fee. Volunteer for one (or more) of the committees. Show your support that you want a community center by becoming a part of the community center.

My friends, it's been a busy month at City Hall and I wanted to update everyone on some of the things we've been working on:

Grants:

1. Fun Park Grant – we were NOT awarded this grant. Will reapply next year
2. Rural Services Grant – Awarded this one!! Please see separate article for info
3. Rural Services Block Grant - The city is applying for this for up to \$75,000. Please see the article describing the Survey that will be in your mailboxes soon.

Christmas Parade: Our Christmas Parade this year will be on Dec 7th with Dec 14 as the alternate date. If a cancellation is declared, we will post on the website winslowar.com and the City of Winslow Facebook page.

FEMA: The City has been approved for FEMA assistance for the June flood damage we received. We are meeting weekly with FEMA representatives to identify, estimate and document the damages to bridges, ballpark and City Hall. No promises, but all is looking positive in Winslow's favor!

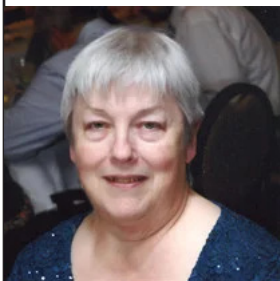

If you have not signed up for groceries at the Winslow Mobile Pantry it is not too late for November's grocery pick-up on Saturday, November 16, 2019 – 1:00 – 3:00 PM at Winslow Community Meals. Forms are available at Winslow City Hall and Winslow Community Meals.

Thank you all the Volunteers from NWA Foodbank, Washington County Sheriff's Department, Bunyard Community Church, Winslow Community Meals, and the Community who made our first grocery distribution go so smoothly. On the first Saturday in October, our first distribution, we distributed boxes of groceries to 85 individual households, along with most receiving potatoes, carrots, apples, cheese, and protein. The groceries covered over 158 individuals. The NWA Foodbank stated that it was indeed one of the smoothest initial starts it has seen and the largest first day in Washington County. Thank you Winslow! Thank you Winslow Community Meals for allowing the Winslow Mobile Pantry to work out of your facility.

We do regret that some of you did not wait around for your groceries due to the long wait; however, the process should become more streamlined as we get used to doing it.

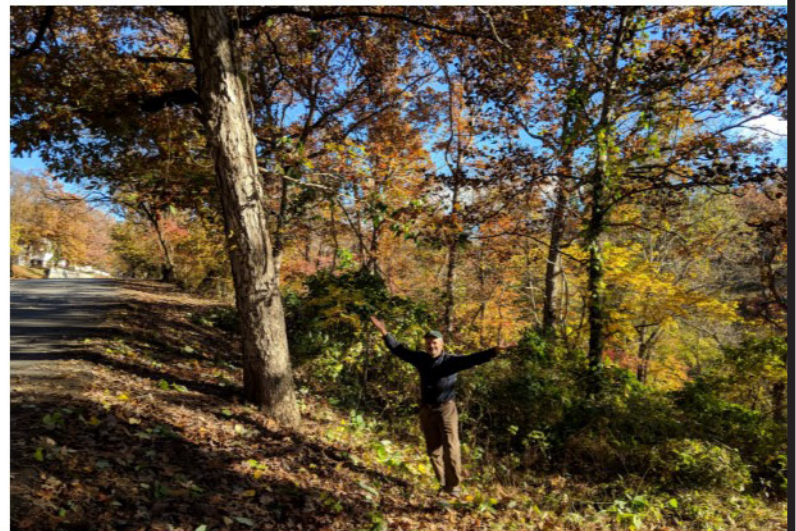

Grief, without questions is much easier; emotionally, physically, and mentally, than grief, with questions.

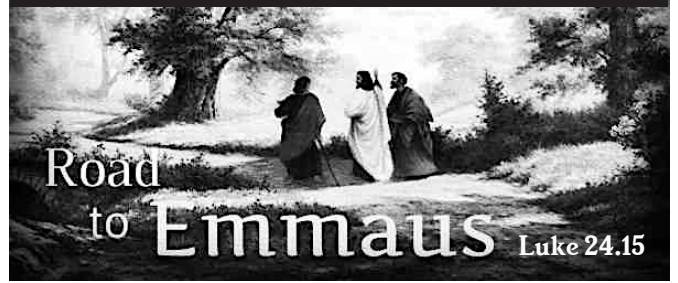
I believe there will be a Judgment day. I believe you and I will be there to answer for "Our" own personal actions.

SEEING WITH THE SOUL

The Bible reminds us that there are different ways of seeing. On one occasion, God sent His prophet Samuel to Bethlehem to anoint one of Jesse's sons to be the next king of Israel. Upon his arrival, Samuel saw Eliab, Jesse's first-born. Eliab was a fine figure of a man—he looked kingly! Samuel was sure he was God's choice.

But God reminded Samuel that He does not see as man does: "For man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." (1 Samuel 16.7.) The Lord's choice was not Eliab, but his younger brother David, "the man after God's own heart." Man sees the external but God sees the soul!

Think of the different ways we see...

1. *Sometimes We See With The Eyes.* This is natural sight. I see a flower. An image is projected on the retina of the eye and carried to the optic nerve of my brain—a purely mechanical function which can be explained in scientific terms.

2. *Sometimes We See With The Mind.* This is perception. A biologist sees the same flower and mentally catalogues it by phylum, genus, and species according to its proper Latin name. He can tell us its life cycle and its possible commercial uses.

3. *Sometimes We See With The Heart.* This is vision filtered through emotion. A man sees the same flower and remembers it was his mother's favorite. He is flooded with tender memories of his mother and his youth. He is not really seeing the flower, but something which it evokes in his memory.

4. *It Is Also Possible To See With The Soul.* This is spiritual perception. Looking at the flower, we see the God who conceived it, created it, and providentially sustains it! It may be taken as an eloquent argument for His existence. (Psalm 19.1-2.) What is seen reveals that which does not yet appear. God's people "walk by faith, not by sight." (2 Corinthians 5.7.)

We must learn to see the unseen! There are things we do not see at this present moment with our natural eyes; we must view them with the soul! (2 Corinthians 4.18.) Many people refuse to believe in anything they can't see with the eyes. But the Bible insists that the things that are truly real are what we see with the soul! What the soul sees is what really matters!
