Hello from the Winslow Water Department! It's lonely in here, but we are staying safe by closing the lobby and the museum to reduce the spread of the coronavirus. Please pay your water bill in one of the following ways:

- Drop it in the City Hall door slot, or drop it in the US Mail slot on the museum side of the building. There are envelopes on a table outside the door for your convenience. Please include your bill stub. If you don't have your bill stub, please ensure your account number or phone number/name of the person on the account is on your payment so we can get your money posted to the correct account. If you are paying in cash and don't have exact change, no worries, we can debit or credit your account the over/under amount and it will be applied to next month's bill.
- Mail a check. Please include your bill stub.
- Pay online using Next Bill Pay. See our website at [winslowar.com](http://winslowar.com) for this option.
- Call in your payment with a credit/debit card number at (479) 634-3901 between 9:00 AM – 2:30PM Monday-Friday. We do not save your credit card information.

As long as the Foodbank provides boxes, we will continue have grocery pick-ups on the 3rd Saturday each month, so please mark your calendars. We may not have extras – it is first come, first serve. We probably will not have any leftover breads, fruits, or vegetables. The Pantry would like to thank WCM for all of its support.

New process: Due to the CV-19 outbreak and social distancing, the USDA allows the Pantry Coordinators to sign for groceries. That is why we are not requiring individual signatures into the computer. PLEASE FOLLOW TRAFFIC DIRECTIONS as we attempt to make the process go as smooth as possible each month. In March, thanks to the Northwest Arkansas Foodbank, Winslow Community Meals, the Volunteers from the Winslow Church of Christ, and other Volunteers, Winslow Mobile Pantry handed out boxes of groceries, bread, potatoes, and onions, to 93 families covering 225 individuals in our area.

Winslow Mobile Pantry Volunteers:

Due to the CV-19, if you are interested in volunteering to help unload the NWA Foodbank truck on Friday, April 17, at approximately 1:00 PM, please call Winslow Community Meals at (479) 634-2800 between 9:00 am – 2:00 PM M-F April 13 – 15, 2020, and leave your name and phone number with Jerry or Sandra. Or you can leave a message for Ann Malkie at (479) 634-2022 or Winslow City Hall at (479) 634-2022 and she will return the call. Upon arrival, the unloading of the supply truck will take approximately 30 minutes and we only need six volunteers. You can also volunteer for the third Friday and/or Saturday for future months. Saturday timeframes are 12:30 PM – usually until 3:30 PM. While we are doing the drive-thru, we are usually done by 2:30 PM. Thank you to all of our Winslow Mobile Pantry Angels.

## More Opening And Closings

What a crazy world we’re living in right now. People are quarantined in their own homes, medical personnel are overloaded, hospital beds are filled and if you have a loved one in a hospital or nursing home you cannot even visit them.

Even a small community like Winslow has not escaped this pandemic. I haven’t heard of anyone that is ill, but it has affected our daily lives. Most, if not all the churches in Winslow, are closed. If you have access to Facebook, some of the pastors are sending their message out on the church’s Facebook page or their website. The Sunrise Service, held every year at Sky-Vue in the Upper Room is canceled.

First Baptist Church of Winslow will hold an outdoor service on Sunday the 5th at 11:00 AM in their parking lot across from City Hall. There will be no Sunday School.

Sky-Vue has their cabins open but is not serving breakfast. They will still make Pizza for take out on Friday and Saturday nights.

Grandma’s Café will be closed at least through April 12th and will reevaluate at that time.

The Gun Shop is open

Brentwood Bluegrass will be closed the 4th and probably the 18th.

Ozark Folkways will be closed at least 2 weeks

The Chester Café and the Neon Moon in Mountainburg were open the last I heard, but you might want to call before heading out.

## City of Winslow – Looking Forward – Construction 2020

Last month we listed anticipated construction projects for which we will have FEMA related funding this summer (depending on CV-19). To date, interest has been limited, so we decided to present this information again. The following is a list of expected opportunities:

Winslow Ballpark: cement foundation related work (tennis court, pavilion, walking bridge), replacing metal fencing, and replacing SB-2 in parking lot.

City Hall: Interior plaster repairs/patching, painting, door frame replacement, replacing flooring in museum.

Other projects: Installing stump pump behind City Hall, pipe line installation, ditch clean outs, exterior rock wall repairs at City Hall and Rock Building.

\*Some of these repairs may require the contractor to be licensed construction contractors by the State of Arkansas.

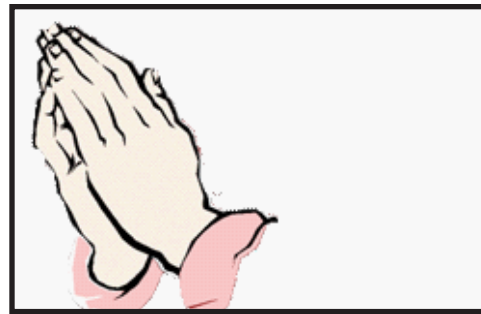
Keep up with me online and drop me a word once in a while. I'm still going strong at 84. Messages are welcome and will be answered.

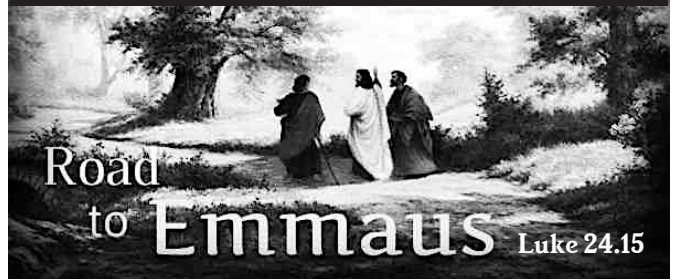

## STRETCHING YOUR SOUL

A man went to a Blacksmith shop one morning to pick up a hoe blade which had been mended. When he asked the blacksmith how much for the job he was told there was, 'no charge.' Insistently he tried to force money into the Blacksmith's hand. The Blacksmith's reply is worth remembering. He said: "Ed, can't you let a man do something now and then — just to stretch his soul?"

We all need to "stretch our souls?" But how is it done?

**1) Communion With God Stretches The Soul.** Paul spoke of some whose souls were diseased and shriveled because of defective worship. (1 Corinthians 11.30.) A proper sense of awe in the presence of God expands our spiritual perception. Large souls are developed through long hours of prayer, praise, worship, and devotion.

**2) Bible Study Stretches The Soul.** The study of the Bible is a broadening experience. Peter counsels us to "desire the sincere milk of the word that you may grow thereby." (1 Peter 2.2.) A genuine attempt to deal honestly with the word of God will make us bigger people.

**3) Kindness Stretches The Soul.** To be kind is to be God-like for "He is kind unto the unthankful and to the evil." (Luke 6.35.) Christianity is the religion of the Second Mile, the Good Samaritan, the Alabaster Box, and the Golden Rule. Jesus was the Man who "went about doing good." (Acts 10.38.) Large hearts make for large souls!

**4) Forgiveness Stretches The Soul.** Spiritual health is conditioned upon our willingness to forgive. Jesus said: "Forgive and ye shall be forgiven." (Luke 6.37.) Resentment, hatred, and grudge-bearing are constricting bands which pinch and squeeze the soul. The refusal to forgive leads to the miniaturization of the soul.

**5) Service Stretches The Soul.** Service is the crux of Christianity. Jesus came not to be served but to serve. (Matt. 20.28.) He told His disciples that "whosoever will be chief among you let him be your servant." (Matt. 20.22.) Jesus illustrated the meaning of service by washing His disciples' feet. (John 13.14.) The extent of our service is the measure of our soul!
