Our lobby and museum will continue to be closed to the public for the month of May. Please mail your water payment or drop it into the door slot at City Hall. You can also make a debit/credit card payment on line at winslowar.com or call the office at (479) 634-3901. Please talk slowly and clearly if you leave a message so we can call you back. Terry and Dianna are generally in the office from 9:00am - 1:00 or so, Monday thru Thursday. No one is in the office Friday, Saturday and Sunday to allow 72 hours for any possible virus contamination to die.

If you are buying a house in Winslow, please call us at (479) 634-3901 to get the water account put into your name. We can fill out a New Customer Application over the phone and discuss ways to pay the meter deposit and transfer fee.

Please keep your sweet canine family members contained during meter reading week, which is around the 15th - 22nd of each month. Your puppy maybe a fur ball of love to people he/she knows, but can appear pretty darn ferocious to a meter reader invading his/her territory. 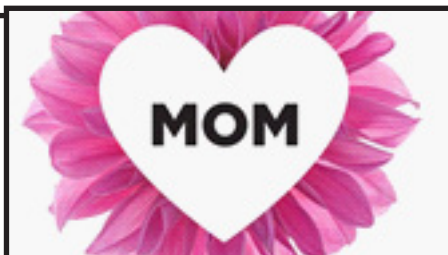
Next pick up Saturday, May 16, 2020 – 1 – 2:30 PM

We probably will not have any leftover breads, fruits, or vegetables. The Pantry would like to thank WCM for all of its support.

New process: Due to the CV-19 outbreak and social distancing, the USDA allows the Pantry Coordinators to sign for groceries. That is why we are not requiring individual signatures into the computer. PLEASE FOLLOW TRAFFIC DIRECTIONS. As we attempt to make the process go as smooth as possible each month. In April, thanks to the Northwest Arkansas Foodbank, Winslow Community Meals, and our regular Volunteers, the Winslow Mobile Pantry handed out 125 boxes of groceries to 100 individuals covering 246 family members in our area.

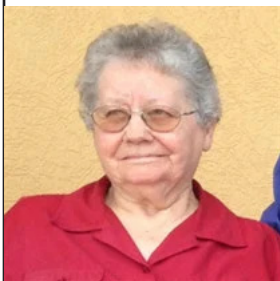

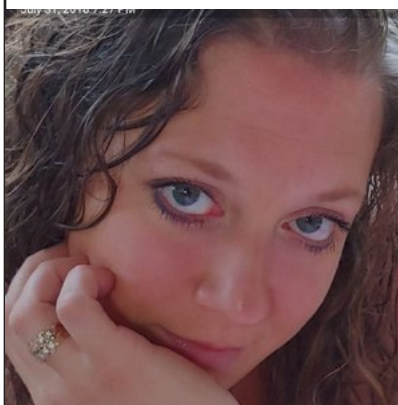

May 23, 1984 - April 6, 2020



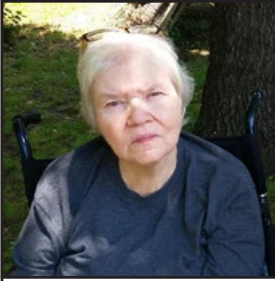

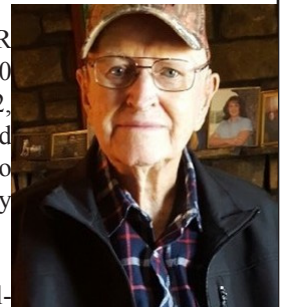

Good thing you reminded me of the upcoming newsletter. I'm so buried in research and writing stories for my newest book, which won't be out for quite a while: Real Stories of the US Marshals of the Western District, I scarcely look up for long moments. The stories I'm uncovering are sometimes shocking, often entertaining, but for sure based as much as possible on the real lives of these brave, tough men involved in the cleanup of outlaws threatening those attempting to settle in Arkansas, Oklahoma including Indian Territory, and the southern half of Kansas after the Civil War ended.

Of course, one of our local favorites will be the story of Jacob Yoes. Born in West Fork, this businessman eventually turned US Marshal at one time opened stores along the route of the newly established Frisco Railroad. Every small town from south of Fayetteville to Yoestown in the River Valley was served by his mercantiles and/or hotels. Readers will be surprised at the other things Yoes was involved in. After serving the political life, practicing law, and acting as a lawman, Jacob was appointed a US Marshal by Judge Isaac Parker after Parker became the youngest judge to serve on the frontier. and was charged with cleaning up the mess caused by the scourge of outlaws threatening law-abiding settlers in western Arkansas, Oklahoma, and southern Kansas.

The deputies hired by Parker and Yoes and those first US marshals were hired to accomplish this job. They did so in some of the wildest battles to hit the frontier. Following the Civil War Fort Smith suffered as one of the most law-infested towns in the area, as bad as the worst of the West in those early days. Outlaws tearing up towns like Deadwood in the badlands of the Dakotas and Dodge City, Kansas didn't hold a candle to the breakouts of outlawry in and around Fort Smith.

You think Rooster Cogburn had it tough. Wait till you read about some of these men whose stories have lain gathering dust in the annals of time. While Cogburn was created for a movie to represent the early days US marshals, his was only a brief look at what went on to clean up the southwest and make it fit for living.

While I work on this book, Oghma Creative Media is making it easier to find your favorite books while obeying the quarantine request to remain home. Because it isn't possible to distribute our newest books, we have offered many of them online as ebooks so you can continue to read the best of our releases. You'll even find some available for .99 cents. So check out your favorite authors or find some new ones by going online. You'll be surprised to see a lot of our quality books there for the best prices possible. So enjoy reading them until we can return to our regular schedule of print book releases.
