The water department continues to be closed to the public. You can contact us via phone at (479) 634-3901 or email us at cityof-winslow@gmail.com. We are attempting to reduce the number of employees in the building at the same time, so I will be in the office afternoons for a while. Please leave a clear, slow, message and I will call you back. If you have a quiet voice, please speak loud enough we can hear you on the answering machine.

We have hired Charles McCarty to work in the office as our new Customer Service Representative. Charles grew up in Winslow and has a very warm personality and a great sense of humor.

Please remember, there will be a 5% rate increase on the water bill you will receive September 1st or 2nd. In addition, residents within the Winslow city limits will have a 2% city sales tax added to their bill. Washington County tax rate was also increased this summer from 1.25% to 1.50%.

We sincerely appreciate all of our customers who are continuing to pay all or something on their water bill during this Covid-19 pandemic. We know it has been tough for a lot of folks, and we thank you for helping us keep the water flowing in Winslow.

Community During Covid

The Winslow Community Development Council is having a quieter end of summer than we have had for many years. In light of the need for social distancing to prevent the spread of this new virus, the council chose to cancel what would have been our tenth Winslow Run.

While we are not hosting this fall, we are still as committed as ever to serving this community. Those who were awarded grants from our 2019 run were met with unprecedented challenges and new circumstances shortly after their projects were funded. Some projects will be completed as soon as possible, others will be replaced with more appropriate plans due to shifting needs.

Ozark Folkways received two grants, one of which was for their on-site Kids Art Camp that was unfortunately cancelled due to the pandemic. Folkways pivoted quickly, and there is now a collection of videos - via the Ozark Folkways YouTube channel - with cooking, art, and American Sign Language tutorials for kids of all ages. (The play list is titled Ozark Folkways 2020 Online Kids Summer Camp, and the videos are available through the end of the year.) The second grant will be used to support upgrades to the building in compliance with Arkansas Energy Code and the Americans with Disabilities Act. The funds will be used for such things as weather-sealing windows, more energy-efficient lighting, ADA door hardware, and threshold ramps. The Winslow Community Center Association, or WCCA, made a similar proposal regarding ADA accessibility at their facilities, and we look forward to seeing that progress when circumstances permit. We hope to share photos and stories of these projects and more in the near future.

Over the past few months, another grant recipient and critical Winslow organization, Winslow Community Meals, has been busier than ever. A grant was awarded and used for critical upgrades to the electrical system, making it possible for the organization to store more perishable items and continue to grow as a mobile food pantry in concert with the NWA Food Bank. The lunch program has continued and grown as the Meals program has provided convenient and safe drive-up/carry-out service. A second project, to paint the building's exterior, will be completed when circumstances allow. In the meantime, the small staff and volunteers continue to rise to the challenge of food insecurity in our community.

In addition to the grants mentioned, funds raised from the 2019 run were donated to both the Winslow Relief Fund and the Boston Mountain Fire Association. Each of these organizations, and many more, are able to support and serve this community thanks to the efforts of volunteers. If you haven't already, consider offering your time. Winslow Water Rates – Starting September 2020

The City Council and Administrator's have to make difficult decisions to keep the Winslow Water System financially sound. This is the first rate increase since 2018 and normally rates are raised annually. Copies of Resolution 2020-008 are posted in the Post Office and other key locations within the City.

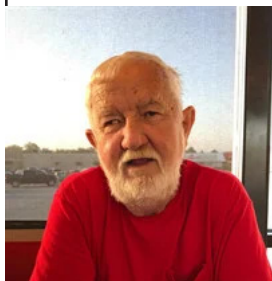

Baby Girls and Airplanes

Many moons ago in my younger days (I would have been in my 20's); I managed to scrape up enough money to take up a lifelong yearning of learning to fly an airplane. After many hours of flight instruction, at \$20.00 per hour that golden moment did arrive and sometime in late 1960 or early 1961, airplane Luscombe 8A N71353 pulled me into the sky on my solo flight. Needless to say, I was ecstatic. I don't remember all of the details, but shortly after my solo flight, I bought this little airplane. A photo of this airplane is hanging on my bedroom wall.

After several months of pleasure flying in 1961, the next life-changing event in my life happened. It was discovered that my daughter, Teresa, was on her way. She would be here sometime in June of 1962.

In December of 1961, the next major event in my life happened. My job moved me and my family (and my little airplane) from North Little Rock, AR to Rogers, AR. In early December, the move was made and normal life resumed. Teresa arrived in the evening of 6 June 1962.

It didn't take long to realize that the expense of a new baby girl and an airplane as a hobby wasn't going to work on the family's income. My wife told me that the airplane had to go. I ran an ad in the Arkansas Democrat and on the 4th of July 1962, I sold my little airplane to an individual in Conway, AR. My wife's sister and her husband were coming from North Little Rock to Rogers on the 4th of July for a 3 or 4 day visit and I arranged for them to pick me up at the Conway airport on their way up.

So on the 4th of July I was at my airplane at the Rogers airport early, climbed in my little airplane and made the 40 minute hop to Conway, and said goodbye to Luscombe 8A N71353.

(Scroll forward in time to 12 May 2020.....)

One sure thing about retirement, a lot of time is spent thinking about things from life past. Good and bad. I've had some bad times in my life, including the death of my only son, Michael and the death of my beloved wife, Joann. Such things I think a person will never "get over".

However, I've had some some good things happen in my life, also. Having Joann as a companion and wife for 60 years, being given a son named Michael for 54 years; and a precious daughter named Teresa; and the grandkids and great grandkids, and my little airplane.

I did enjoy flying and I think about those times quite a lot. I was sitting here at my computer of nights ago and my thoughts turned to little N71353.....

And I thought, "I've read or heard sometime long ago that the FAA keeps track of all airplanes forever", and I wondered..... So I typed "locate private airplane by tail number N71353" in the search bar, hit enter, and BINGO! Look what turned up! I found it!! My little airplane, N71353 is now at home in Texas. Kinda' southwest of Austin, and southwest of where Eric, Michael's son and my grandson and his family now live. Hmmm..?

So goodbye for now, more later (maybe). (SW Texas??!)

RECYCLING RESUMES SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 5th

Winslow Recycling will resume on Saturday, September 5th at the usual site across the tracks from City Hall on the edge of Peek's Park. Volunteers **will not** be present.

For this long-anticipated event, this list may help folks prepare for next month.

If it can't wait, recycling can be taken to 1420 S. Happy Hollow Rd. in south Fayetteville, N. on 71 and E. at the old IGA onto MLK (15th St.), 2-3 mi. behind Quality Collision Repair.

It's open 7 days/wk, 24 hrs/day.

Due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, everyone will have to wear a mask and maintain at least 6 feet of physical distancing. Also, whether gloves are worn or not, everyone is advised to bring and use hand sanitizer afterwards.

2. Please rinse out (all food particles from) all cans, bottles, and plastics

--or the entire contents of that bin and barrel may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

3. Please place materials (plastic bottles, steel cans, etc.) in the right bin and container--or the entire contents of the bin may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

4. LIST of accepted and clean recyclables:

IN THE BINS OF THE TRAILER:

--#1 See-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom. (ex: soda and water bottles, peanut butter jars, etc.)

--#2 Non see-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom (ex: milk and water jugs, etc.)

--#2 Colored and opaque—must have neck smaller than the bottom (ex: liquid detergent, shampoo, etc.)

--**NO** margarine, yogurt, or other plastic tubs!

--Mixed paper and magazines (must be DRY)—printer paper, junk-mail, slick-coated paper, envelopes, etc.

--**NO** paper plates or cups, milk or juice cartons, frozen, food containers, egg cartons, etc.

--Newspaper (incl. regular phone books)

--Steel cans

IN THE BARRELS:

--all colors of glass

--old fabric, belts, shoes, small toys

IN THE TRUCK:

--cardboard and brown grocery bags

IN THE PLASTIC BAGS ON GROUND TO LEFT OF THE TRAILER:

separate into two groups:

--aluminum soda and beer cans (to take for cash to Winslow Community Meals)

Special Circumstances Due to COVID-19: If you are submitting absentee ballot application it is important to remember to request and return your application in a timely manner. The deadline for mailing an Absentee Ballot is 7 days before the Election, to ensure that you receive your ballot in time to guarantee delivery back to the County Clerk's office before the deadline we ask that you request your absentee ballot well before this deadline. Ballots will be mailed out on or after September 18th.

Voting at the polls will require social distancing, and identification.

Early voting for Winslow is at the West Fork Community Center:

October 19 – 30, 2020 - 8:00 am – 6:00 pm.

The City of Winslow will have a voting site in Winslow on November 3, 2020. However, due to social distancing requirements the poll location has not yet been determined and will be posted closer to election date.

Voting hours: 7:30 am – 7:30 pm.

Election 2020 Unprecedented

The 2020 Presidential Election is one that (as the old saying goes) “you will live to tell your grandchildren about”.

Seriously, Washington County is very concerned about everyone’s health as we go into the 2020 election. The basic electoral process will be the same, but many safety measures are being implemented, six-foot social distance markers will guide you to the voting machines, hand sanitizer throughout the polling location for you to use, neither poll workers nor voters are required to wear a mask but are strongly encouraged to do so. Each machine will be sanitized after each voter. As your turn comes up you will be handed a stylus and a ballot. You will be required to present a valid picture ID that you will hold while showing it to the poll worker. After signing the tablet and printing the ballot, you will use the same stylus at the voting machine to choose your candidates. You will then place the ballot in the ballot box. The stylus is yours to keep or discard in a bin provided for that purpose. If left, they are sanitized for a future election.

If you or anyone you know are still concerned about coming out and voting at your polling center you can vote by absentee ballot. You can request an absentee ballot by calling the County Clerk’s office at 479-444-1766 or emailing the County Clerk at blewallen@co.washington.ar.us or download the application at co.washington.ar.us. Your reason for requesting the ballot should be marked UNAVOIDABLY ABSENTEE.

If you are not registered to vote, you must do so at least 30 days prior to the election. You can then download your Voter Registration Card.

Ballots will be mailed out on and after September 18th. Overseas and Military ballots will be mailed first.

Fill out your ballot and Voter Statement and return your ballot by the deadline.

The deadline for requesting a ballot by mail is OCTOBER 27th. In person or by Designated Bearer the Monday before the election, November 2nd.

The deadline for returning an absentee ballot is:

By mail, Election Day November 3rd.

In Person or by Designated Bearer is MONDAY, NOVEMBER 2nd.
