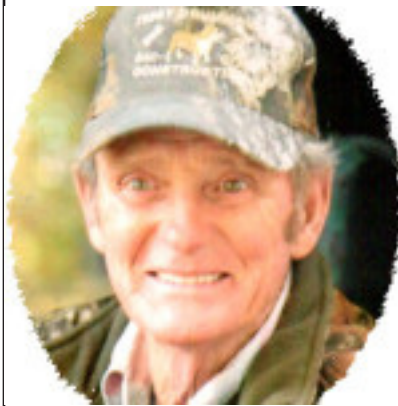
May 4, 1968 - November 9, 2014

“The Cavern”

Turtle shell can be manipulated in jewelry along with gold, silver, and even rock. Knives and cutting tools can be made with iron, rock and even wood. Poke salad stalks at given intervals, can produce a poison that will stun the nerves of that which it strikes, such as an animal or man. Other plants can produce the same effect. Sources of information to all of this are within the cavern. Medicinal plants, bark, and berries, weeds, flowers, and even mud, were used to treat certain ailments. “Faith healing” was also present during the Indians time period of “Yesteryear”.

Within the cavern, there is possibly the existence of information leading to certain events of the future, or at least what the American Indian thought might happen hundreds of years prior to any event, natural disasters, exploration of men of unknown origins and even events of the modern world today. Though Indian life was of a simple theory – mostly to survive, imagination did exist as did insight.

As much as I have read concerning the Indian in this area, he was not a cave or cliff dweller as such. No sign exists in the cavern that he actually resided inside and it may have purely been a place to get out of the wind and a religious area of concern, or a place of learning. Burial is not totally out of the question, yet maybe for only the “Grand Pubas of the Tribes.”

Arrows and bows were long in structure. Bird-points are longer than the average arrowhead points, while knives - many were of rock. Rounded rocks made for good clubs. Women did more than have babies and cook. They skinned and tanned hides. One painting actually portrays a woman instructor – a very unusual position undoubtedly by other paintings. Acorn-type bread, possibly a hot water bread, was a nourishment. Meat, though what seemed to be plentiful, was sometimes replaced by other types of vegetables – corn, maize, dandelion. Goldenrod and harrow was used as well as tubers within roots, mud and tree sap, and bark, covered sores and cuts, along with other weeds and plants. Fish was eaten and recycled back into the farming effort. More info was available.

At one time five or six tribes enhanced the area, different tribes. Trade was evident, so I truly believe that what little Spanish Armor appeared was possibly traded for something. Different items of interest appeared here and there. Many people in our area today have actually seen part of a painting from the cavern, but till now did not know it. Wonder where they saw it – think about it ... It is not painted exact, nor in its entirety, but some of it does appear by a modern day artist! Imagine that! Hallelujah!

My personal opinion is that this disease of the bats could be caused partially due to a fungus or mold I saw around a tree base not long ago. It was indeed a spore of some type, and though thick in structure, at the bottom was white powder in nature. Of course I could be wrong. None the less, when I entered this cavern years ago there was no bat problem. Yet at the same time in the cavern there are no bats for whatever reason. I’ve never been inside since the bat problem arose and try to do everything by the book. I have a feeling that if I ever did return, I wouldn’t ever want to leave it. Getting a lot older now and feeling the brunt of things, I need some

more peace of mind. What a place of existence! Hallelujah!

There are some new books at the Library by some of your favorite authors, Michael Connolly, Clive Cussler, John Grisham, and several others.

The next meeting of the Winslow Friends of the Library will be Saturday, December 6, 2014 at 1:00 PM. We will finalize our plans for serving Chili at the parade and discuss matters pertaining to moving the Used Book Store into the old computer room, cleaning out the other rooms in the building. Have you all picked up everything that you may have left at the Library or Book Store at any time? That is the first step in getting things cleaned up.

We are desperately in need of ideas for fund-raisers and people to help carry them through. The Friends group provides the internet access for the Winslow Library and funds the Within Winslow Newsletter each month. Our costs for those two items alone have been costing us approximately \$225.00 a month. We have used all the funds that had built up over the years and are using the last certificate of deposit that we had in reserve. Most of the ladies that are in the group have seen the back side of 50 and some of us the backside of 70. We don't have the oomph that we had a few years ago. The only ongoing year-round fund-raiser is the Used Book Store and when fully stocked and not running sales we take in about \$50.00 – \$60.00 a month. So, all you talented people out there please join us with your brilliant ideas preferably some that don't require a lot of manual labor.

Our Christmas fund raising project for the last two years has been a silent auction on gift baskets. This year we have almost twice as many baskets as last year. They are some lovely baskets. We have craft baskets, cooking baskets, tea baskets, baskets with candles, a basket with a \$25.00 gift certificate from Harps, and several others. Bid on one for a gift and a second one as a gift for yourself. They will be on display at the Library until 3:00 PM on December 13th; they will then be taken to The Mercantile for people to make their final bids. Bentley Chili

(Don't know if this will be one of the chili recipes used but it sure sounds potent for those who can handle it!)

Twelve servings (unless a Bentley 10)

- 1/2 pound dried pinto beans (kidney)
- 2 - 28oz. Cans whole tomatoes (home canned best)
- 4 slices dried tomatoes optional but good.
- 1 large green pepper. Two + seeded jalapeño (optional.)
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1 or 2 clove garlic, shucked minced
- 2 pounds ground venison and one pound 90% ground beef.
- 2 tablespoons chili powder (heat)
- 3 tablespoons cumin (heat)
- Salt pepper to taste

Soak beans overnight rinse check for rocks, simmer until soft. Drain and place in crockpot; add tomatoes, peppers, onion and garlic.

Brown and drain hamburger meat. Brown venison add both to crockpot. Add chili powder, salt and pepper, and cumin. Mix thoroughly and cover. Cook on low for 8-14 hrs. Or on high for 4-5 hrs. Taste for seasoning and adjust. You can add one package of the 4star chili for filler, texture, and color.

Serve with grated cheese, chopped onions, sour cream and Rol-aids.

Matthew 6: 5 thru 8

5. And when thou prayest, thou shalt not be as the hypocrites are: for they love to pray standing in the synagogues and in the corners of the streets, that they may be seen of men. Verily I say unto you, They have their reward.

6. But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet, and when thou hast shut thy door, pray to thy Father which is in secret; and thy Father which seeth in secret shall reward thee openly.

7. But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking.

8. Be not ye therefore like unto them: for your Father knoweth what things ye have need of, before ye ask him.

It's right after that he says "this is how you should pray". Saying this prayer is totally committing and submitting your life to the Father by Faith in Verse 8.

My Father who art in Heaven, Hallowed be your name. Your Kingdom come your will be done in my Life as it is in Heaven. Provide my needs today. Forgive me as I forgive others. Lead me not into Temptation. Deliver me from Evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, And the Power, And the Glory Forever. Amen
