What's Going On In The City Park?

You may be wondering what is going on along the stream on the east edge of the city park, also known as "Peek's Park" (after Peek Avenue bordering the south edge).

The work being done is for erosion control on the west bank of

the stream, which has been eroding rapidly over the years. You may have noticed the handsome stonework recently complished to hold the bank around the culvert just below the stone planters. The idea was initiated by Mayor Jarnagan and

carried out by our city workers.

To remedy the bigger problem, representatives of the WCDC, as well as Mayor Randy Jarnagan, arranged to meet in early November 2013 with John Pennington and Courtney Thomas of the Beaver Watershed Alliance for advice and assistance. The Alliance has given Winslow 80 free plants to place along the stream in order to anchor the bank. These are shrubs, as well as a few secondstory trees.

Starting this Saturday and Sunday, volunteers will be using a tractor and truck to clear the Bermuda grass off a swath along the stream measuring about 15 by 250 feet, after which they will be hand-picking of the grass and weeds from the soil. Next week, soil and mulch will be brought in for volunteers to spread there in order to help reduce weeds in the future.

Anyone wishing to volunteer is invited anytime after recycling (noon) on Saturday, April 5, continuing Sunday and into next week.

Winslow Beautification Project

It's planting time in Winslow! The Winslow Beautification Project, underwritten by the city, needs some folks who enjoy gar-



dening and would like to volunteer once a week (time can be determined later) to work on the Winslow public gardens. This will involve planting, weeding, cleaning and preparing beds, and sharing ideas. We would love to have any Master Gardeners in the area join us, although no training or experience is necessary.

If interested, come to the Mercantile at 10:30 am this Saturday (April 19) or call Donna Phipps Stout (herself a Master Gardener) at 634-5791, or email her at dphippsstout@centurytel.net, and we will set up a weekly work schedule.

The Winslow public gardens include the following: the stone planters and new stream-side erosion-control plantings in Peek's Park (across the tracks from City Hall); the barrels on the sidewalk along City Hall, Winslow Museum, and Mercantile; the oak tree planter across from City Hall; the Winslow Welcome rock at the highway; and the Larry Jaranagan Memorial stone planter in the ball park.

Got Ideas to Improve Winslow?

The Winslow Community Development Council needs interested people to attend the meetings, which are the second Tuesday in every month. The WCDC was formed years ago to raise money to help improve the quality of life in Winslow. We are actively seeking people who have ideas--and who see needs not being met--to come and brainstorm with us!

The next meeting is at 7 PM on April 8th at the Winslow School, during which we will have the election for new officers, for which any Winslow resident is qualified to run. Come and participate!

Ideas which have been discussed recently include securing a grant for an exercise trail (funded through a Trails for Life state grant) around the ball field park; discussing the fate of the Winslow School campus; and starting a community food co-op.

The majority of money the WCDC raised in the last three years has come from the Annual Winslow Run, which attracts participants from across the region and nation, and raises thousands of dollars that are distributed by vote of the council, in consultation with folks who attend the monthly meetings.

Organizations which have benefitted include Community Meals, Winslow Library, Winslow Museum, Fire Department, Ozark Folkways, Community Emergency Fund, and 4-H.

Also, the WCDC has funded the new Winslow kiosk in Peek's Park, and serger and sewing machines for the Olive Loom group (a Winslow cottage industry which sews and sells its products). And a few of the projects in which WCDC has organized are the Rain Barrel Workshop last year and the new Rain Garden Project at the ball field pavillion, which is funded through a federal, state, and local partnership, and will be installed with the help of the 4-H this month. Come join us on April 8th!
