## Ozark Folkways

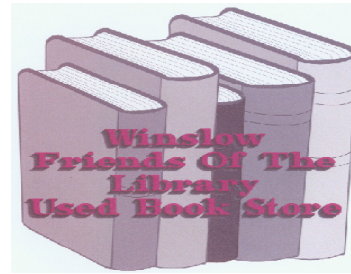

# Cass's Canine Rescue

Today when I opened the barn door and expected Lacey to run outside for her morning "walk," only Yang (cat) met me...and she was very agitated. I didn't think I let Lacey stay at the Peddler's, so I went upstairs to see if she was sick. She wasn't sick...she was dead. Only 14 hours earlier when I put her in the barn for the night, she was alive.

Lacey was one of Cass's puppies. She was born nearly 6 years ago beside I-540 at the Chester exit. She was the runt; she was the quiet one; she had one blue eye and one brown eye; everyone loved her and she loved everyone. Her best friend (after Omer, her brother, disappeared) was Jasmine, but Jasmine disappeared a few weeks ago too.

Since there have been eight disappearances and five other mysterious deaths of rescue dogs/puppies just in the past six months, I have contacted the Crawford County Sheriff's office regarding this problem. I hope that if there are people in this area who have information regarding any or all of these incidents, they will contact the sheriff's office as soon as possible. The number is 479-474-2261.

Now, a note to person(s) who did this...

If you are trying to make me quit the business of the Barefoot Peddler, forget it. It's a needed service to the area's communities as it provides affordable (even cheaper than Wal-Mart) items to purchase. It should be a vital part of this area and, maybe once local residents see it as such, the business will flourish as it did in the beginning. In at-

tempting to exert your power over my work to provide this service, you have only strengthened my resolve to continue. The Peddler is one of CCR's (Cass's Canine Rescue) sources of income. If you are trying to make us quit our effort to provide a rescue area, spay/neuter opportunities and other information regarding pet ownership, then once again, you have only strengthened our resolve.

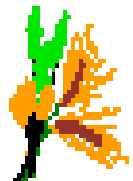
Something to consider....

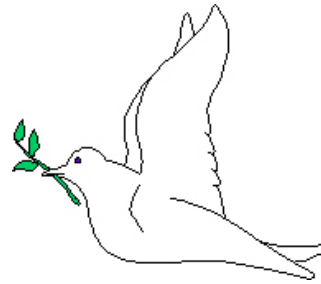

He rose from the dead, with U in His plan?

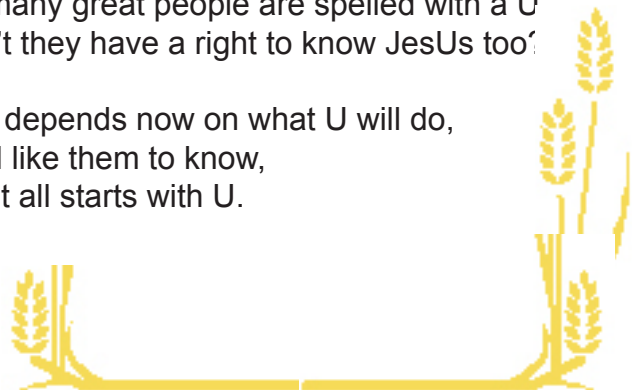
The stones split away, the gold trUmpet blew,

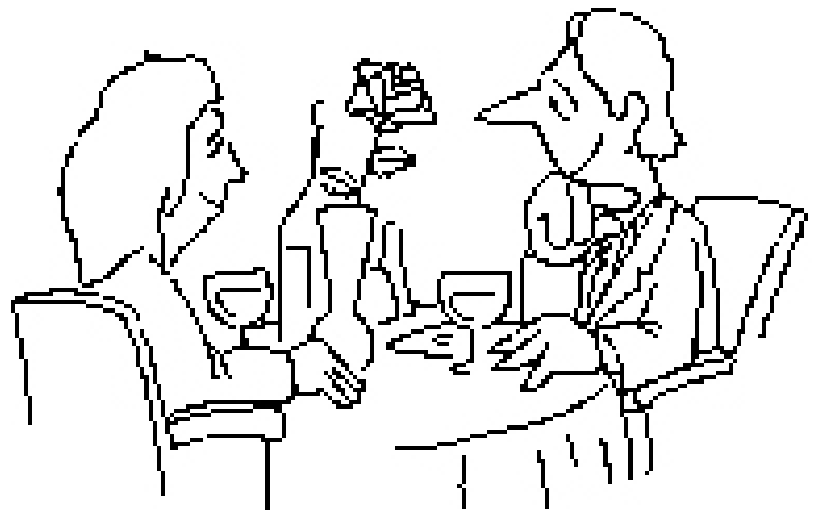
