# Hello From The Winslow Water Department!

We hope everyone is staying warm, dry and enjoying the fall colors! Please check out our website:

You can also continue to drop your payment into the drop box on the museum side of City Hall, at 108 North Winslow Blvd. This drop box is a secure way for mail to be dropped into City Hall. The slot on the door should not be used. City Hall and the Museum are currently being renovated, and anything put into the small slot on the City Hall door, could get lost in the construction materials on the floor of the lobby. The water department is being run from an alternative location, however, we pick up your payments at City Hall daily.

We are currently interviewing for another employee in the office. Until we get someone hired and trained, our hours are 9:00AM - 2:00PM Monday through Thursday. If you call and I'm unable to get to the phone, please leave a message or shoot me an email. I will return your call! When we get our new office help trained, we should be able to get back to being in the office 9:00AM - 3:00PM Monday through Friday. The Water Department continues to be closed to the public to help keep our staff safe and healthy during the covid-19 pandemic. We are doing business and setting up new accounts, etc. over the phone and via email:

If your account has a past due balance of \$100 or more, we need you to do the following to avoid shut off:

- \* Pay 25% of the past due plus the current bill each month.

If you are a renter:

- \* You must pay your water bill every month to avoid shut off.

It is important that you pay something on your water bill every month to avoid shut off. Please call us. We will work with you, if you are making a sincere effort to pay your water bill. Water is important for survival, please budget for it.

If you are paying off a large leak:

The system automatically adds a \$10 late fee to your past due balance on the 21st of the month. As long as you are making an effort to pay something regularly, I remove your late fee on the day I print the bills. Keep in mind, if you are checking the balance of

your bill online, the system will tell you there is a \$10 late fee from the 21st of the month until the day I print the bills. If you are paying something on your bill each month to pay off a large leak, disregard the late fee, it will disappear! If not, just give me a friendly call.

We realize these are challenging times and appreciate everyone who shares kindness and a smile to our employees. You are not just our customers, but our neighbors and friends. We apologize for inconveniences our staffing shortages have incurred over the past few months. We're working hard to rebuild our staff and we are hopeful. We've added Zack Simpson and Jake Bentley to our staff and are honored to have them join us! Now we are looking for a special person to complete our team as a Customer Service Representative.

He is the man in charge of the Washington County Road Department. His office number is 479-444-1700 and his cell number is 479-879-1785. He would love to hear from you. Now he

is a politician so just keep calling and you will get his attention. If your driveway has a sign with RD and four numbers following it, the county will grade it twice a year but you have to call them at the above numbers.

Please encourage your family and friends to call so we can get our roads up to par with the rest of Washington county roads. Remember it's the SQUEAKY WHEEL THAT GETS GREASED, so call often.



## Winslow Water Department Resumes Shut Off Notices

Since the arrival of the covid-19 virus in March, we have suspended water shut offs for non-payment. We are sincerely thankful for those who have continued to pay what they can on their water bill, even though money can be tight. We are happy to work with you on your water bill during these, challenging, uncertain times. Contact: (479) 634-3901 or cityofwinslowar@gmail.com.

After 8 months of suspended shut off notices, we must set limits again, to remain a financially viable water utility provider.

If you are a home owner and have a past due balance of \$100 or more, and have made no effort to make a payment on your water bill in September or October 2020, your water will be shut off on November 10th, 2020. If meter locks that belong to the Winslow Water Department, are cut off, the home owner will be charged \$15 for destruction of city property. If the water meter is damaged, the homeowner will be charged an additional \$250.

Renters are not allowed to carry a past due balance. If a renter has made no effort to pay on their water bill in September or October 2020, your water will be turned off November 10, 2020.

Delinquent accounts involving renters:

Delinquent Water accounts on rentals will now be put into the landlord/home owners name and the home owner will be responsible for paying the water bill. There will be no more split billing.

Calling the Winslow Water Department repeatedly, to say you are going to pay on a specific day and not follow through, will still result in your water being shut off.

Protocol is that you pay at least 25% of your past due bill, plus your current bill to keep your water on.

Unkind treatment of Winslow Water Department employees will not be tolerated in person or on the phone.

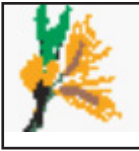
Due to CV-19, WCM will continue to serve the community by providing the call-in and pick-up dinners (479) 634-2800 from Meals, until we believe it is safe.

## Master Naturalist Organization

The Master Naturalist organization is for adults of all ages and skill sets who want to learn more about the natural world and participate in volunteer projects that contribute to conservation in Arkansas. Master Naturalists are volunteer educators, citizen scientists and stewards of the environment, striving to protect and preserve Arkansas' natural health and beauty.

Applications are now being accepted for the Northwest Chapter new members annual training. Classes start in late January preparing for graduation in May. Naturalists in Training (Nit training) 2021 will occur via Zoom, with approximately 50 hours of virtual lectures and interpreted hike videos, with time allowed for discussion. Nits have a choice of attending either Saturday mornings or Wednesday evening classes, which typically last 3-4 hours. Topic related field explorations for both individual and/or small groups, socially distanced, will vary in format and location.

Training focuses on a range of topics specific to the Ozarks, including ecoregions of Arkansas, fungi, geology, birds, trees, native plants, water quality and meteorology. To graduate to full Master Naturalist status, one must attend a minimum of 40 hours training/field instruction. Cost is \$135 for the training and materials plus \$30 annual dues. Cost is \$80 for an additional household member if materials are shared. To become a Certified Master Naturalist, members must complete eight hours of continuing education and volunteer 40 hours annually.

# RECYCLING WILL BE HELD SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 7<sup>TH</sup>

Winslow Recycling will be Saturday, November 7 at the usual site across the tracks from City Hall on the edge of Peek's Park. Volunteers **will not** be present.

This list may help folks prepare for recycling. If it can't wait, recycling can be taken to 1420 S. Happy Hollow Rd. in south Fayetteville, N. on 71 and E. at the old IGA onto MLK (15th St.), 2-3 mi. behind Quality Collision Repair.  
It's open 7 days/week, 24 hrs/day.

## 1. Due to the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic, "MASKS AND SOCIAL DISTANCING ARE REQUIRED!"

(It has been proven that the "aerosol" mist from our breath can carry further than 6 feet and can linger in the air, even outside!)” Also, whether gloves are worn or not, everyone is advised to bring and use hand sanitizer afterwards.

2. Please rinse out (all food particles from) all cans, bottles, and plastics --or the entire contents of that bin and barrel may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

3. Please place materials (plastic bottles, steel cans, etc.) in the right bin and container--or the entire contents of the bin may be trashed by Boston Mtn. Solid Waste.

## 4. LIST of accepted and clean recyclables:

### IN THE BINS OF THE TRAILER:

- #1 See-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom. (ex: soda and water bottles, peanut butter jars, etc.)
- #2 Non see-through Plastic Bottles—must have a neck that is smaller than the bottom (ex: milk and water jugs, etc.)
- #2 Colored and opaque—must have neck smaller than the bottom (ex: liquid detergent, shampoo, etc.)
- NO margarine, yogurt, or other plastic tubs!
- Mixed paper and magazines (must be DRY)—printer paper, junk-mail, slick-coated paper, envelopes, etc.
- NO paper plates or cups, milk or juice cartons, frozen, food containers, egg cartons, etc.
- Newspaper (incl. regular phone books)
- Steel cans

### IN THE BARRELS:

- all colors of glass
- old fabric, belts, shoes, small toys

### IN THE TRUCK:

- cardboard and brown grocery bags

### THE PLASTIC BAGS ON GROUND TO LEFT OF THE TRAILER:

separate into two groups:

- aluminum soda and beer cans (to take for cash to Winslow Community Meals)
- clean aluminum pie plates, foil, cat food cans, etc. (for Winslow Community Meals)

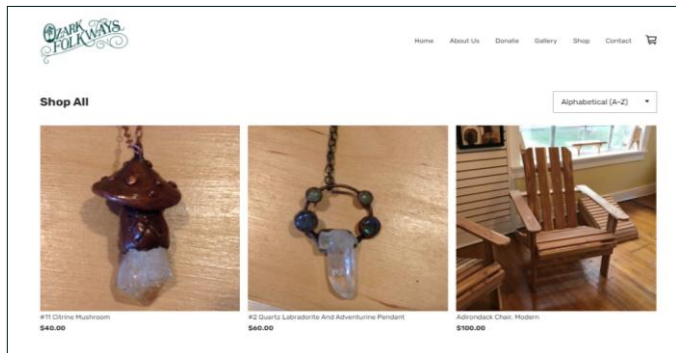

Never be afraid to try something new. Remember that a lone amateur built the Ark. A large group of professionals built the Titanic.

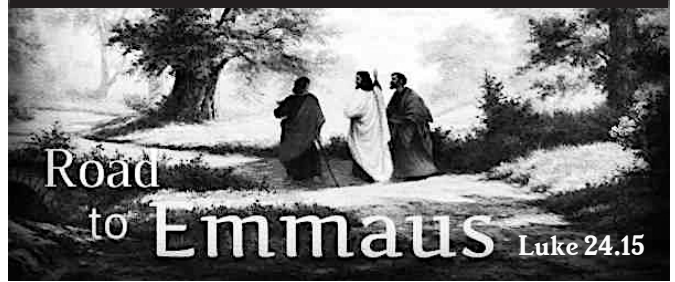

## COURAGE TO MAKE MISTAKES

As coach of the UCLA Bruins, *Johnny Wooden* led his basketball teams to an unprecedented 10 national championships. Equally amazing is the fact that over his 40 year career, his teams averaged winning a phenomenal 80% of their games year after year.

In his autobiography, *They Call Me Coach*, Wooden offers some interesting insights into the coaching philosophy that enabled him to compile his remarkable record. Wooden used to constantly remind his players that "The team that makes the most mistakes will probably win." That seems the opposite of what coaches usually say! But Wooden explains: "Doers makes mistakes, and I want doers on my team — players who make things happen."

Perhaps, there are some takeaways in that observation for us.

1) *Mistakes Are Inevitable.* That is as true of life as it is of basketball. The only players that never make any errors are the ones who never play!" We can expect to make mistakes on the job, at home, even in service to the Lord. The Jerusalem church mistakenly mistrusted the genuineness of Paul's conversion and Paul himself admitted that he had been mistaken in his assessment of the character of John Mark. (*Acts 9.26; 15.37-38; 2 Timothy 4.11.*)

2) *Mistakes Don't Have To Be Fatal.* Programs do not necessarily have to be junked because mistakes have been made in implementing them. Leaders do not need to resign and workers don't have to be fired just because plans miscarried. This is true our personal lives as well — one mistake is no reason to give up the good fight! Mistakes can be overcome. In fact, mistakes may become the very stepping stones to success.

3) *Mistakes Are Not As Deadly As Stagnation.* Mistakes are the result of doing! They demonstrate that at least we are still trying. Jesus told about a man who was so afraid of doing the wrong thing that he did nothing. And, according to Jesus, that was the greatest mistake of all! (*Matt 25.24-30.*) "It is sin to know what you ought to do and then not do it." (*James 4.17.*) Mistakes are made by doers and it is the doers who get the job done — on the basketball court and in life!
