Sometime in the early morning hours of Sunday, November 26th, the Winslow Library was the target of a break-in and malicious mischief resulting in the theft of DVD's and other Washington County Library property. They apparently entered through a window that was smashed out with a rock. Another window was smashed for no reason. A

filled with books were pushed over, damaging books and book-cases.

None of this makes any sense. Winslow is a small community, A community who pulled together to make Winslow Library, the Internet Café, and the Friend's Bookstore a reality. Many people volunteered their time and energy, cleaning, painting, and moving books and furniture. Others, who couldn't physically help, donated money to pay for specialized labor that had to be hired. This is a slap in the face for all the people

Meet Hunter Schulze, son of Evan and Shella Schulze of the Delaney area, a first grade student at Elkins School.

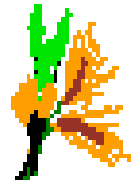
