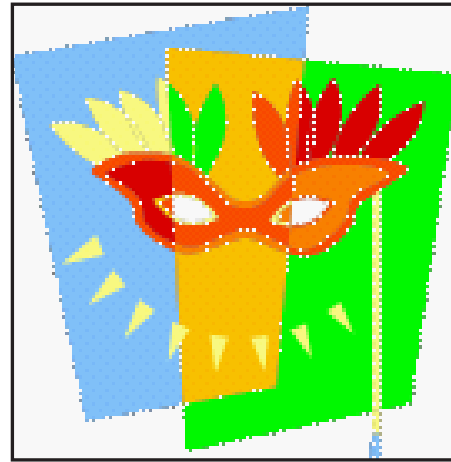

#### PAYING THE PRICE

A rich young ruler once came to Jesus with a question about the cost of eternal life: "Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may obtain eternal life?" (Matthew 19.16.) He was interested in something worthwhile and good. But he was unwilling to pay the price Jesus asked.

Jesus told him that the price was a willingness to give up everything in order to have the kingdom! "Go," He said, "and sell your possessions and give to the poor... and come, follow Me." (Matthew 19.21.)

Repeatedly the Bible emphasizes that the price for the Kingdom of God and eternal life is a complete surrender of self. (Matthew 6.33, 16.24, 22.37.) Tragically, many are unwilling to pay the price.

**1) Many fail to recognize the value of the Christian life.** Our world has distorted values. Many no longer recognize real value. Our world has been compared to a department store where a chimpanzee got loose one night and mixed up all the price tags. The next morning potato peelers were \$1000 and mink coats were 99¢. So many people have never learned the real value of things.

**2) Others Are looking for a religious bargain.** A store selling religious trinkets had a sign in the window: "Cheap crosses for sale." Many are looking for exactly that! They want a bargain basement religion! They get very little out of their religion because they put very little into it. You can get a cheap imitation at a cut rate but for the genuine article you must pay the full price.

**3) Some are trying to buy too many things at once.** People think they can "have it all," including God and the world, at the same time. But Scripture says, "If any one loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him." (1 John 2.15.) No one can afford both Christ and the world!

**4) For many the price is just too high.** They are unwilling to pay what the Kingdom costs. Jesus insisted, however, that it is worth any sacrifice we have to make for it. (Matthew 13.44-50, 19.12.) To be genuine disciples of Christ it may be necessary to give up aims and ambitions which are very dear... to abandon habits and pursuits which are hard to lay down... to surrender comfort and leisure for Jesus' sake. Only those willing to take up the cross could be His disciples.

It will cost you something to be a Christian. In the long run it will cost a lot more not to be one! Are you willing to pay the price?

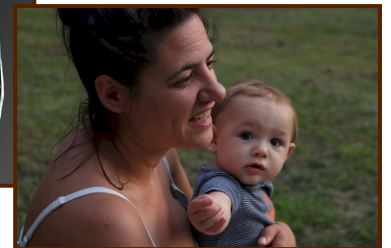
